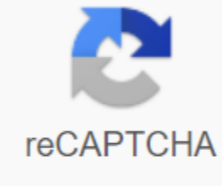




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Harry potter character development sheet

Potterheads around the world, rejoice! Now we have official versions of the anime Harry Potter characters we know and love so well! Warner Bros. Japan has licensed images of all your favorites - including Marauders, Hedwig, and Buckbeak - for use on official Harry Potter merchandise. The all-new HP swag is currently available exclusively in Japan, but it didn't take long for the items to make their way through this large, Pacific Pond. For years, fans have been calling for an anime adaptation of J.K. Rowling's beloved series. A quick search of Harry Potter on deviantArt shows just how popular Potterheads are with anime-esque fanart. While Warner Bros. Japan isn't using new versions of the anime characters of Harry Potter to announce a Japanese adaptation - yet - that hasn't stopped fans from hoping that the anime or manga series is on its way. Right now, you can get your hands on some sweet file folders featuring your favorite characters. Pinback buttons and cell phone charms in secret boxes are slated for spring 2016 release, as are acrylic trinkets. Anime Harry Potter merchandise is priced from 300 to 750 yen - about 2.49 to \$6.23 - which means you don't have to spend all the galleons to get a Harry Potter fix. The full cast of the character looks like this: Harry Potter/Ron Weasley/Hermione Granger/Draco Malfoy/Fred and George Weasley/Severus Snape/Albus Dumbledore/Sirius Black/Remus Lupin/James Potter/Hedwig/Buckbeak there are several notable absences. On the side of the world, Dobby, Hagrid, Luna, McGonagall, and Neville are absent, as are the more popular, darkly aligned characters Bellatrix Lestrange and Lord Voldemort. Also, James Potter is an odd choice for merchandising, in my opinion, like Buckbeak. I won't complain about the hippo, however, because he's damn cute. The 13 characters selected for anti-qualification almost certainly reflect the tastes of Japanese potterheads. If you don't see your favorite character on the list, don't worry. If the product is popular - and you know what it will be - Warner Bros. Japan will certainly release a larger, wider lineup for next season. Some fans have expressed dismay at the anime images of the Weasley brothers, saying the boys are more blonde than redheaded. While they are certainly not as blonde as platinum blocked by Mr. Malfoy, they are noticeably smaller than remus Lupin's ginger. (It's worth noting that while Rowling describes Lupin as having brown hair, actor David Theoplis' locks were clearly more red than brown when Harry Potter hit the silver screen.) In addition, more than a few Potterheads have noticed similarities between Fred and George Weasley and another set of anime twins: Hikaru and Kaoru Hitachiin of Uranus High School Host Club. As this letter, the anime Harry Potter merchandise has yet to make it to the English-language retailer who engage in Japanese-language tariffs such as how Shop Kawai and Daiso Japan.
