## Fairbite (opening 3<sup>rd</sup> November)

Work is well underway towards our new Fairbite social supermarket project. In partnership with Cambridge City Foodbank, St Paul's will be setting up a Fairbite Food Club to provide affordable food shopping to members on low income. We hope that this will reduce the need for Foodbank emergency parcels, and strengthen relationships with our local community.

Lucy and Eileen from CCFB are working to install the shop in the Lower Tower Room. Do get in touch with the office (office@stpaulscambridge.org.uk) if you could help with clearing and tidying the space ready for the shop. Contact Emma (emma@stpaulscambridge.org.uk) if you would like to be involved in volunteering longer term. As a volunteer you might:

- Show people round the shop and help them choose their items (10 items for £5, plus fruit and veg and various extras)
- Make teas and coffees and chat to people in the community café
- Restock the shelves and set up the shop ahead of opening times
- Pick up supermarket donations from a local shop or café

# Summer Party: board games and meal deals (31st July)




We had a lovely time playing
