This year, two Texas teams, one from Austin and the other from San Antonio competed to take home the title. San Antonio is our home, so coming home after a long season is so great, said University of Texas student El Paso Amber Najera. The crowd always goes wild. Najera performs in the colorful guard of the San Antonio Band Crossmen. Normally, it plays for the UTEP band, but the last three summers have been spent in San Antonio and on the road. We have three weeks left and we will keep pushing to the end, Najera said. Each band team ranges from 150-200 students. This year, Crossmen Band had two students from Japan compete with them. The San Antonio band finished 11th overall in the competition. Austin's team, Genesis, came 19th. Each year, students from more than 30 local high school bands come together to present an entertaining musical evening that is undoubtedly one of Fiesta's most popular events. Some of the highlights include herald trumpets, band parades with colorful and swirl flags, and bands performing their award-winning UIL shows for the crowd. At the end of the evening, all the musicians will perform together in a spectacular finale set in fireworks! The Battle of Flowers Band Festival was first held in 1937, and is the oldest and longest running band festival in the country. The aim of the Band Festival is to offer secondary school bands a unique opportunity act together and encourage their interest in music.
