These are the main questions that start each test. The examiner will then move on to a personal topic with four questions related to it. The examiner can only ask an exact question on the map. He won't explain any questions if you ask - he'll just repeat the question once, and if you don't understand then he'll move on. You may ask about the meaning of specific words - for example: Examiner: What is your favorite season? Candidate: What do you mean by season? That is ok! The examiner will ask about 2 topics and then move on to Part 2 (combined with the basic intro questions, which is about 11 questions in Part 1). Take a good look! Most questions will be shared, so try not to give personal examples or talk about yourself (that's fine if you do it sometimes). Typically, the examiner asks 6 to 10 questions in this part of the test. The examiner should paraphrase what's in his book (as opposed to part 1 where he just reads from a pamphlet). That's why students will report slightly different wording for questions - not two experts will use exactly the same words, but the meaning of the questions will be the same. The expert should also ask one follow-up question on each question in the brochure. These follow-up questions will vary depending on the expert, and if you are a strong candidate the examiner will ask more difficult questions to challenge you. Read on!
