The first step in the registration process is to submit an application to the State Care Board in the state in which you intend to obtain a license. Request with your nursing board regarding a specific enrollment process as requirements can vary from state to state. Registration at Pearson VUE. Once you have received confirmation from the Nursing Board that you have complied with all your government requirements, continue, register and pay the fee to take NCLEX with Pearson VUE. NCLEX uses a computer adaptive test (CAT) that responds to the answers you give to determine your level of competence. The selection of questions is based on the NCLEX-RN test plan and the complexity of the product. Every time you answer a question, your computer overestimates your abilities based on all the previous answers and the complexity of these test elements. Your first question is relatively simple, if you choose the right answer, the computer delivers you a more complex question from your bank of questions. If you choose the wrong answer, the computer gives you a simpler question. This process continues throughout the exam until the test plan is met and your computer is able to determine your level of competence. Also, there is no way to miss the question, you have to answer it or the test will not move on. You can't go back and see the previous questions and change the answers. The NCLEX-RN Test Plan NCLEX testing plan is a content recommendation to determine the distribution of test questions. NCSBN uses the Customer Needs category to ensure that the full range of care activities is covered by NCLEX. It is a summary of NCLEX's content and scope as a guide for candidates preparing for the exam and directing the writers' paragraph in the design of the elements. The content of NCLEX-RN is organized into four main categories of customer needs that include: Safe and Effective Care Environment, Promoting Strengthening and maintenance, psychosocial integrity, physiological integrity. Care Management (17-23%) The category includes content that tests the nurse's knowledge and ability to guide care, which improves the conditions of care to protect customers, significant others, and medical staff. Safety and Infection Control (9-15%) The category includes content that tests the nurse's ability to protect customers, families and medical staff from health and environmental hazards. Promoting health promotion and maintenance (6-12%) The category includes content that tests a nurse's ability to provide and guide customer care, which includes knowledge of expected growth and development, prevention and early detection of health problems, as well as strategies to achieve optimal health. Psychosocial Integrity Category Psychosocial Integrity (6-12%) content related to the promotion and support of the emotional, mental and social well-being of the client, experiencing stressful events, as well as clients with acute or chronic mental illnesses. Physiological integrity in the physiological integrity category are elements that test a nurse's ability to promote physical health and well-being by providing care and comfort, reducing risk potential and managing health changes. There are four subcategories under physiological integrity. NCSBN indicates that the decision to skip or fail is governed by these three rules: the 95% confidence interval rule, the maximum exam duration rule, and the time rule. 95% Trust Interval Rule In this scenario, the computer stops administering test questions when it is 95% sure that your ability is clearly above the passing standard or clearly below the passing standard. Maximum length exam When your ability is close to the standard of passing, the computer continues to give you items until the maximum number of items is reached. At the moment, the computer ignores the 95% trust rule and decides whether or not you are passing the final assessment of the ability. If your final ability score is above the passing standard, you pass; if it's lower, you don't. The Downtime (R.O.O.T.) Rule When you run out of time to reach the maximum number of items, the computer has not been able to decide whether or not you have passed with 95% certainty and should use an alternative rule. If you don't answer the minimum number of questions you need, you will fail. If you've at least answered a minimum number of items, your computer is reviewing your last 60 questions. If your ability score has been consistently above the passing standard for the last 60 questions, you pass. If your ability has fallen below the passing standard, even once, during the last 60 questions, you don't. How many questions do NCLEX have? For NCLEX-RN, the minimum number of questions you need to answer is 75, while the maximum number in the test is 265. Regardless of the total number of questions you answer, you are given 15 experimental questions (preliminary questions). Preliminary questions are indistinguishable from other test questions not specified as such, are tested for future examination and are not counted from your score. The types of questions in NCLEX-RN While most NCLEX elements are multiple options, there are other formats. You can manage items with multiple choices and questions written in alternative formats. These formats may include: multiple answers or choose everything that applies, fill in an empty calculation, ordered response, access, figure, chart or exhibition, graphic, audio and video. Never group or assume that they are related to each other.
