But how can I add a deb to my system then? jreese: sudo apt update && sudo apt install chromium-browser/dists/bionic-updates/Release.gpg this will (of course) install chromium-browser from ubuntu so you'll have to take this from your list of open chromium windows there Ah. I found an answer online. There are always two possible sources, main and main-updates, in the repository. (This is Debian, so this is not Ubuntu) But, both sources are signed for free. tomreyn: But I still can't install it. I always get this message: "E: Version '42.0.2311.135-1' for 'bionic-updates' was already published. (This is in chromium) that's fine, it's warning you about a possible repository conflict. Ok. I can just ignore it, right? jreese: yes, maybe use a different sources.list location or disable the security repository temporarily. this should just be temporary, you should soon be able to update again tomreyn: I tried this before with apt-get, but didn't work. This time I tried "sudo apt install chromium-browser/dists/bionic-updates/Release" which did not work? or, did it work but you did not succeed installing it? This command gave me "E: Version '42.0.2311.135-1' for 'bionic-updates' was already published. I didn't see the last part because it was canceled by the warning message. so the warning was from what 520fdb1ae7

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
