
### MOMS AND DADS CLUB BRINGS ON BINGO NIGHT!




## **OUR 2025 FIDELITAS MEDALIST: RICHARD TRZCINSKI (P'70)**

Each year at the Ambassadors Ball, we honor our Fidelitas Medal tradition. We are excited to announce our 2025 Fidelitas Medalist, RICHARD TRZCINSKI (P'70).



The FIDELITAS MEDAL, first awarded in 1949, is presented in recognition of one's Fidelity in serving God, country, and the Orchard Lake Schools. Fidelitas medalists are evaluated for their realization of the religious and cultural ideals of the Orchard Lake Schools founder, the Rev. Joseph Dabrowski, a Polish missionary priest, who established the original education institution in Detroit in 1885.





"God is my pillar of strength, and the power of prayer can help accomplish what we are all here to do – to thrive," said Hamtramck native Richard Trzcinski. "I am so blessed to be honored as the 2025 Fidelitas Medalist! It is such a privilege to be part of the 140-year history of the Orchard Lake Schools and help build upon the faith, education, culture and tradition that continues to shape the future of generations to come."

The Richard & Mary Trzcinski Quad within our campus community is one of the many such efforts that connects our founder's mission and vision – the footsteps of the past, including those of a saint – with the present and future. Richard and his wife, Mary, have made extraordinary, transformative contributions to the Orchard Lake Schools that also include the Ever Forward Strategic Planning Project initiative.

The St. Mary's Preparatory graduate of the Class of 1970 and commercial real estate developer who founded and is the president of Primerica Group One, Inc. in Tampa, Florida, believes that the Orchard Lake Schools community is grounded in the religious and cultural ideals that Fr. Dabrowski, a Polish missionary priest, first established in Detroit in 1885. It is the place where all those within our campus community, both near and far, grow and prosper. "These are some of the major reasons Mary and I made the gift for the beautification of the Quad," said Trzcinski. "And with the implementation of the St. Mary's Preparatory Girls Division now in its fifth year and the strong leadership of headmaster Len Karschnia and his faculty and staff, we know the students here will continue to grow and prosper into future leaders in society."

Richard Trzcinski was born in Hamtramck, Michigan, and experienced very humble beginnings. By the fourth grade, he and his family moved to Shelby Township, and he went on to attend Orchard Lake St. Mary's Preparatory where he lettered in basketball, baseball, and golf. He was also elected sports director by the student body. He has fond memories of growing up with the brotherhood that is St. Mary's. "Back then, all students lived in the dorms," he said. "The Class of 1970 was special. We had a daily regimen that began with a structured breakfast followed by Mass, classes, athletic practices, and study hall. We all kept busy. That is one of the secrets to what made the student body who we are today. That time management regimen helped prepare me for my acceptance into the University of Michigan."

The spiritual aspect of the Orchard Lake Schools family is very dear to his heart just as his own family is at the center of everything he does. Just like his three daughters have grown and prospered, he wants nothing more than for the Orchard Lake Schools to reap the core values inherent in the historic, grounded campus foundations. "It's a place where young men and women are thriving on their motivation and good grades, alumni and friends are networking, and all those who come here, even if they are just passing through, are engaging in cultural traditions, and following their spirituality entrenched in their core moral values," he added. "God is their pillar of strength, and the power of prayer can help us all accomplish what they are here to do – to thrive."


#### ST. JOHN PAUL II LITURGICAL CENTER UPDATE

Easter is a "movable feast" determined by the lunar calendar. Its date was established by the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. as the first Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox. Therefore, the date of Easter falls, depending on the full moon, between March 22 and April 25. Easter and the Sacred Triduum that precedes it is the highest moment in our liturgical calendar, it is the greatest feast, because we celebrate the "Paschal Mystery" (Jesus' death and Resurrection). Let us read St. John Paul II's reflection on Jesus' Resurrection given in his address on Sunday, April 21, 1996:

#### IN THE WORDS OF ST. JOHN PAUL II

1. In the liturgical season running from Easter to Pentecost, the Church is recollected in contemplation of the risen Christ. Thus she relives the primordial experience that lies at the basis of her existence. She feels imbued with the same wonder as Mary Magdalen and the other women who went to Christ's tomb on Easter morning and found it empty. That tomb became the womb of life.

Whoever had condemned Jesus, deceived himself that he had buried His cause under an ice-cold tombstone. The disciples themselves gave in to the feeling of irreparable failure. We understand their surprise, then, and even their distrust in the news of the empty tomb. But the Risen One did not delay in making himself seen and they yielded to reality. They saw and believed! Two thousand years later, we still sense the unspeakable emotion that overcame them when they heard the Master's greeting: "Peace be with you."



2. The Church is based on their extraordinary experience. The first proclamation of the Gospel was nothing other than the testimony of this event: "This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses!" (Acts 2:32). The Christian faith is so linked with this truth that Paul did not hesitate to declare: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor 15:14). Along these lines the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community, handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 638).

Christ's Resurrection is the strength, the secret of Christianity. It is not a question of mythology or of mere symbolism, but of a concrete event. It is confirmed by sure and convincing proofs. The acceptance of this truth, although the fruit of the Holy Spirit's grace, rests at the same time on a solid historical base. On the threshold of the third millennium, the new effort of evangelization can begin only from a renewed experience of this Mystery, accepted in faith and witnessed to in life.

3. Regina caeli, laetare! Rejoice, Holy Virgin, because He whom you bore in your womb is risen! Dear brothers and sisters, let us try to relive the joy of the Resurrection with Mary's heart. Even in the darkness of Good Friday she prepared herself to receive the light of Easter morning.

Let us ask her to obtain for us a deep faith in this extraordinary event, which is salvation and hope for the world.

#### THE TRADITIONAL POLISH EASTER BASKET

**BUTTER** (*Maslo*) • We often see butter formed into a lamb (*Baranek Wielkanocny*) or cross. It symbolizes the good will of Christ we should have toward all things.

**EASTER BREAD** (*Babka*) • A round or long loaf topped with a cross or fish, symbolic of Jesus, who is the Bread of Life.

**HORSERADISH** (*Chrzan*) • This is symbolic of the Passion of Christ still in our minds.

**EGGS** (*Jajka and Pisanki*) • These are often decorated with symbols of Easter and represent new life and Christ's resurrection from the tomb.

**SAUSAGE** (*Kielbasa*) • This food is symbolic of God's favor and generosity.

**HAM** (*Szynka*) • This meat symbolizes great joy and abundance, and some prefer lamb or veal.

**SMOKED BACON** (*Slonina*) • This represents the overabundance of God's mercy and generosity.

**SALT** (*Sol*) • It is a necessary element in our physical life, representing prosperity and justice and a time to remind us people are the flavor of the earth.

**CHEESE** (Ser) • This food symbolizes moderation Christians should have at all times.

**CANDLE** • A candle represents Christ as the Light of the World.

**LINEN COVER** • A linen or other cloth cover is placed over the top of the basket and removed in time for the priest's food blessing on Holy Saturday.




The Church celebrates ordinary jubilees every 25 years. In December 2024, Pope Francis ushered in the Holy Year 2025 by opening the Holy Doors of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome for a year of grace, forgiveness and renewal — centered on the theme, "Pilgrims of Hope."

In 1470, Pope Paul II established the practice of celebrating jubilees every 25 years, instead of 50, to allow more people to experience a Holy Year within their lifetimes.

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. WITEK





#### **POLISH INSTITUTE UPDATE**

#### A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

The Polish Institute of Culture & Research is the recipient of a DigMichNews Grant from Clarke Historical Library at Central Michigan University. The grant allows the Polish Institute to digitize existing microfilm of the magazine *Niedziela* (Sunday), published by the Polish Seminary in Detroit between 1891 and 1909. This will allow us to provide access to this important early publication to researchers anywhere in the world through the web. The Clarke Historical Library has a large collection of digitized Michigan newspapers, but *Niedziela* will be the first non-English language publication to be added to this important collection.

*Niedziela* was the very first publication of what we know today as the Orchard Lake Schools. It was founded by Fr. Józef Dąbrowski and staffed by faculty and students of the Polish Seminary. It was designed to advance Fr. Dąbrowski's goal of educating the growing Polish community in the USA (and of course to advertise the work of the Seminary).

*Niedziela* was published each week and designed for people to read on days off from work. It contained articles on current events, the Catholic faith, history, literature, and scientific discoveries. It made a special effort to promote the Polish language, and readers were reminded to "speak to your children in Polish." While most of its readers were in Michigan,

it circulated in Polish communities all over the Midwest. Although Fr. Dąbrowski was not the editor, his impact on the magazine was clear, especially in the regular columns on science, one of his favorite subjects. The magazine continued to be published after Fr. Dąbrowski's death until 1909, when the Seminary moved to Orchard Lake. After a few years, it was replaced by a new publication, *Sodalis*, which continued for many decades thereafter.

The Polish Institute is very grateful to Clarke Historical Library for this grant and the opportunity to share a piece of our history with people across the state and the world.

#### FR. JÓZEF DĄBROWSKI POLISH LANGUAGE SCHOOL RECEIVES \$1,000 GRANT

Language is the foundation of literature and literature is the foundation of culture. The Fr. Józef Dąbrowski Polish Language School, originally started in 1993 by Mrs. Alina Paszek with Msgr. Stanley Milewski's encouragement and support, has been operating continuously since then on the Orchard Lake Schools campus although it is its own separate 501 (c) 3 corporation. Ms. Grażyna

Stanowski is the school's current director, and it continues to operate on the OLS campus. Its classes are conducted in the Library every Friday evening. It has two sections. One is tailored to younger children, teaching elementary Polish and the other for older children, teaching more advanced Polish. It is run by parents.

The Edward and Josephine Wikiera Foundation's charter is to support and promote Polish culture. It finances the Polish Institute of Culture & Research at Orchard Lake. The Wikiera Foundation's Board of Trustees recently approved a \$1,000 grant towards the Fr. Józef Dąbrowski Polish Language School recognizing its important role advancing Polish culture and its longstanding relationship with OLS. The unrestricted grant will help the school acquire needed supplies.

When the seminary existed, seminarians taught the students Catholic religion and prepared many children to receive their first Holy Communion. With the seminary gone, the Polish Language School is fortunate to have a teacher, Ms. Benita Wojciechowski, who has a degree in theology. She prepares students who may not attend a Catholic school to receive their first Holy Communion. That Polish school is very worthy of continued support.


