Easter commemorates the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. It represents our eternal salvation. We renew our faith and rekindle our spirit as we reflect on Jesus' ultimate expression of love, one where he forgave those who wronged him. Let us remember His grace and be more compassionate toward others as we call upon forgiveness, even in these uncertain times. Please remember that after every Good Friday, there is an Easter Sunday!

Easter symbols help remind us of new life much like changing seasons. The Easter bunny, although not an ancient biblical reference, is a symbol of fertility and life. It is said that the Easter bunny tradition was first introduced to the Americas in the 1700s, and that nests were replaced with decorated baskets filled with symbols of the holiday and blessed on Holy Saturday.

The Traditional Polish Easter Basket

Butter (Maslo): We often see butter formed into a lamb (Baranek Wielkanocny) or cross. It symbolizes the good will of Christ we should have toward all things.

Easter Bread (Babka): A round or long loaf topped with a cross or fish, symbolic of Jesus, who is the Bread of Life.

Horseradish (Chrzan): This is symbolic of the Passion of Christ still in our minds.

Eggs (Jajka and Pisanki): These are often decorated with symbols of Easter and represent new life and Christ's resurrection from the tomb.

Sausage (Kielbasa): This food is symbolic of God's favor and generosity.

Ham (Szynka): This meat symbolizes great joy and abundance, and some prefer lamb or veal.


Smoked Bacon (Slonina): This represents the overabundance of God's mercy and generosity.

Salt (Sol): It is a necessary element in our physical life, representing prosperity and justice and a time to remind us people are the flavor of the earth.

Cheese (Ser): This food symbolizes moderation Christians should have at all times.

Candle: A candle represents Christ as the Light of the World.

Linen Cover: A linen or other cloth cover is placed over the top of the basket and removed in time for the priest's food blessing on Holy Saturday.



May the grace and compassion of this Lenten season be with you and your rekindled spirit. We encourage you to join us for Mass, whether in person or via our Orchard Lake Schools Facebook live stream (no account required). You are in our daily prayers. May the grace of God shine upon us. Have a blessed Holy Triduum and Easter Sunday!

It is difficult to believe that just over one year ago the COVID-19 pandemic halted our country. We watched the news in disbelief of what was happening on other continents. We prayed for the health and well-being of our loved ones, including our campus community family both near and far.

After welcoming our history-making, Class of 2024 Girls Division last fall, we have witnessed their amazing partnership with Ford Motor Company's WiM (Women in Manufacturing) and STEaM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) programs, and are proud of the mentorship opportunities that will be available to our students.

From academics to service to athletics, our students have demonstrated that our in-person hybrid learning model has helped them grow, serve, and thrive. We are so proud of their accomplishments, including those recently inducted into the National Honor Society.

We are blessed to have the spiritual support of good, faithful priests who have remained on campus throughout most of the last year and continue to do God's work through SS. Cyril & Methodius Seminary, weekly in-person and live stream Masses, and outreach to parishes in surrounding communities. They pray for us daily, and please remember them in your prayers.




... The Polish Mission Introduced Its New Website?






CONGRATULATIONS, SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS
