Randomized Clinical Trial of a Culturally-Tailored Suite of Smoking Cessation Resources for American Indian Persons

NIH

Given that American Indian (AI) persons experience one of the most extreme smoking inequities, a scalable and culturally-aligned smoking cessation intervention could have a meaningful public health impact in this population. Through engagement with tribes and AI serving clinics and nationally drawn community advisory boards (CABs), our team has conducted multiple preliminary studies to culturally tailor NCI's Smokefree TXT and QuitGuide smartphone app for AI persons. The present study will culturally-align the final Smokefree resource (Smokefree.gov) and then utilize mixed-methods to evaluate the efficacy of Smokefree for Natives, a suite of culturally-aligned digital cessation resources, among AI persons who smoke.
