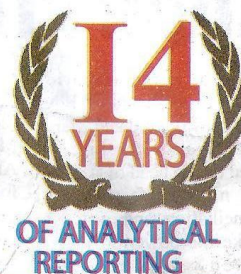

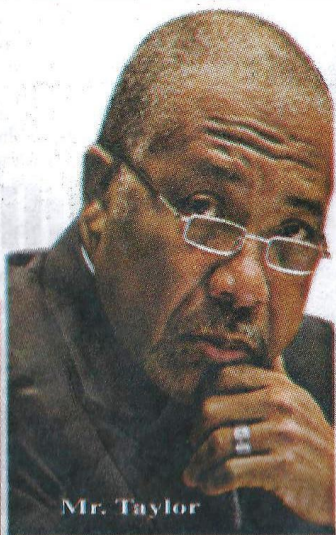

Ellen Pressed For Taylor Benefit

Lawyers Want Her Correct Govt.'s "Abominable Error"

Government officials contacted to settle long-accrued benefits for ex-president Charles Taylor refer his lawyers to the Civil Service Agency for solution, and others are calling for adequate consultations, perhaps for President Sirleaf's advice, before giving a clear answer. The Kemp & Associates representing Mr. Taylor's interest in the matter think the responses are an "abominable error" and seek the correction of such an "error". Meanwhile law firm, represented by its chief of litigation Cllr. J. Sayma Syrenius Cephus, has put the matter squarely on the laps of President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, as **The Analyst** reports.

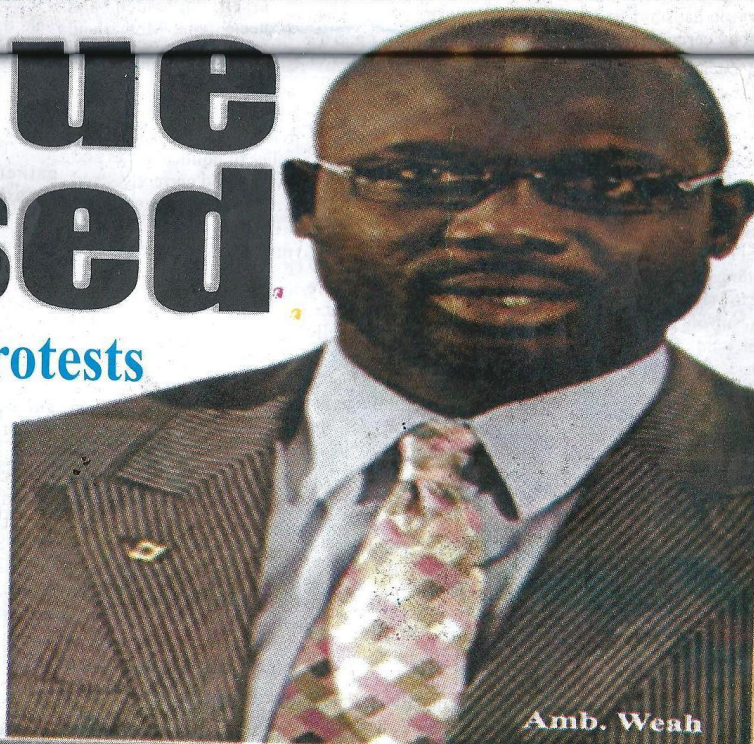
Ahead Of April 12 Planned Protests

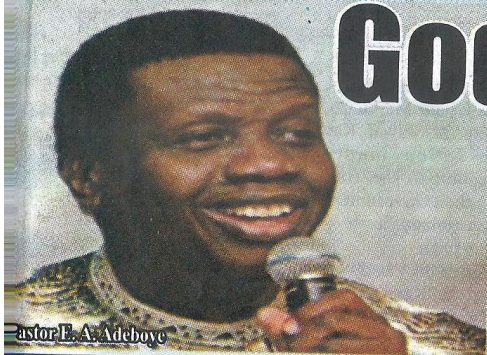
Pastor E. A. Adeboye Declares

Ellen Pressed

In a communication addressed to President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, dated March 26, a Liberian law firm has called on the head of state "in the name of national reconciliation and peace to invoke the power so in you vested, by the 1986 Constitution, in order to cause the unconditional settlement of my clients' legitimate entitlements in the same speedy manner and form as it was done by Your Excellency, for the late President Samuel Kanyon Doe."

Cllr Cephus outlined difficulties posed in the way of obtain his client, Taylor's, benefits by the Ministry of Finance and Justice. "I represent the legal interests of former constitutional President and Vice President of the Republic of Liberia, Excellences, Dahkpannah Dr. Charles Ghankay Taylor and John D. Gray, and as result of this, I have written numerous communications, paid visitations and made personal contacts with officials at these ministries, pleading with them for the settlement of my clients' retirement benefits but to no avail," Cephus said, adding: "As it now appears, it

received another letter from the Ministry of Justice under the signature of the Deputy Minister for Economic Affairs, in which he said former President Taylor's demand for his "just entitlements" is now a subject of some consultations, "with no time frame given as to when final decision will be made. See a copy each of the letters from the Ministries of Finance and Justice attached."

Cephus' communication to President Sirleaf further states: "Excellency, while I may have my own personal disagreements with some of your policies on a number of critical national issues, I however find it absolutely nauseating to agree with the false impression that is being continually created by some public officials both at the ministries of Justice and Finance that Your Excellency, will have to give an authorization or make some kind of mobile phone call here and there, before the retirement benefits of my clients can be paid, even though these benefits are provided for, under the 1986 Constitution."

held at the Honorable Supreme Court of Liberia, and presided over by the venerable professor of law and sagacious jurist, His Honor, Mr. Justice Philip A. Z. Banks, III, then in chambers, and at that conference, the government lawyers, openly recognized the legitimacy of our clients' retirement benefits but pleaded that the matter be withdrawn to have same amicably resolved at the Ministry of Justice.

Cllr Cephus: "Sadly, the months of January and February, 2013 have come and gone, and we are now at the doorsteps of the month of April, 2013, and still there is no affirmative action taken despite a series of communications, personal visitations and mobile phone contacts made, pleading with Ministries of Justice and Finance to see reasons and pay my clients' retirement benefits."

He said his communication to President Sirleaf was an SOS call—the last gasp for hope that is being made on behalf of your fellow citizens and friends—two of the most venerated public officials of our great country, "people who like

avoid further conflict. CBDP says the protest will undermine prevailing national peace and stability.

CBDP in a release said demonstration historically plays a lead role into the country's backwardness and as such said it is incumbent upon the Peace Ambassador to dialogue if the Liberia is not to be plunged into another devastating situation.

The release signed by Mr. John Kamma, the Executive Director of the group, sympathized with the peace ambassador for the loss of his mother due to illness, but also used the occasion to acknowledge Amb. Weah's immediate dialogue amongst

the citizens could be the best way forward in order to avoid national upheaval as the planned protest has the tendency to derail gains made in the last 15 years

The group said while it is true that under the constitution citizens have the rights to peaceful assembly, it must be noted that the intention of the demonstrators could be compromised by people who also seek to foment trouble and chaos.

CBDP says Liberia has suffered too long, warning Liberians to continue nurturing peace and refrain from anything not in the interest of the citizens.

CBDP in its release noted that there are lots of things that are on the docket for discussion in the interest of the country cardinal to its development for which citizens are to thank the international partners for buttressing government's effort to create opportunities.

The group said while there may be some errors being made by government, it is better to engage national leaders constructively rather than instigating conflicts that warmongers will use to destabilize the country under the canopy of planned protest initiated by some civil society organizations.
