ABOUT THE PROJECT



Routes & Roots (R&R) is a **week youth exchange** that brings together young people from different backgrounds to explore sustainability through art, creativity and shared experiences. Inspired by the idea of **roots** — *our values, identities and connection to nature* — and **routes** — *the paths we choose to shape the future* — the project invites participants to reflect, create and act together.

Through **non-formal education and artistic practices**, the exchange raises awareness about environmental challenges and the urgent need for more sustainable ways of living. Art becomes a common language to understand complex issues, express concerns and imagine alternative futures.

The project offers an **inclusive and safe space** where young people are encouraged to actively participate, share their perspectives and transform ideas into creative actions. By working collaboratively, participants develop a sense of responsibility, environmental consciousness and a positive attitude towards change.

At the same time, **Routes & Roots** aims to build a strong community of young changemakers. By connecting participants through **collective artistic projects**, the exchange strengthens networks of youth committed to sustainability, cooperation and long-term impact beyond the experience itself.

Day 3 · Culture in Motion

Discovering culture through sport, rhythm, and body-based expression.

Day 4 · Art & Creativity

Exploring artistic expression through nature-inspired art and creative workshops.

Day 5 · Biodiversity & Environment

Learning about local fauna, flora, and environmental awareness through interactive activities.

Day 6 · Outdoor Life & Team Spirit

Strengthening group bonds through outdoor activities, games, and shared experiences.

Day 7 · Culture, Identity & Urban Expression

Exploring cultural diversity, local heritage, and urban art through creative and intercultural activities.

Day 8 · Reflection & Departure

Reflect on learning, discuss next steps, and say goodbye.
