It was a wonderful occasion where a number of members battled through the incessant down pour to show their support and encouragement for Margaret. One of the readings of the day was from *Psalm 28* whose verses are



appropriate for the people of Ukraine and indeed has been for people over the centuries.

Psalm 28: To you, O LORD, I call; my rock, do not refuse to hear me, for if you are silent

to me, I shall be like those who go down to the Pit. Hear the voice of my supplication, as I cry to you for help, as I lift up my hands toward your most holy sanctuary. The LORD is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts; so I am helped, and my heart exults, and with my song I give thanks to him. The LORD is the strength of his people; he is the saving refuge of his anointed. O save your people, and bless your heritage; be their shepherd, and carry them forever.

The people of Europe and beyond, have responded with such generosity and passion to help alleviate the needs suffered by the people of Ukraine. Save our beloved Ukraine. Bless her with freedom, with holy Light


of your gracious reign.

Support for Ukraine: There was a gathering of support for the people of Ukraine at the Immigrants Flame in New Ross. The evening consisted of words of support from various members of the community who are involved in several projects to help the people of Ukraine in their time of need and raise awareness of their plight. The evening also included

reports from the county, concluding with prayers offered from the local clergy. It was highly significant and heartfelt that members of the community, originally Ukraine were present, showing the unity of all for their country of birth. As a sign of our prayers for those in the Ukraine and those who now find themselves as refugees candles were lit and
