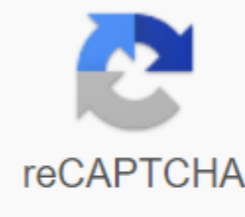

First, meetings are meant for purpose, but what usually happens is that the goal gets hijacked by a strong personality for a variety of reasons: They've never gotten a memo about what the meeting is about, they think they have the right to run a meeting the way they want (rather than what's best for the organization), or they just don't know better. So, when the topics begin to fall out of the way, any participant can return to the original intentions on the board and ask: Is what we are discussing in accordance with the purpose of this meeting? It's a conflict-free way to remind people to keep the sidebar conversations for later. Invite the right people. A lot of meetings stagnate because the wrong people in the room. Namely, decision makers who have not been able to attend send their number two, who, faced with a decision at the meeting, are afraid to decide because he or she is not the decision-makers. Having a goal when the meeting is delayed does three things: First, it makes people focus on performance. Second, it builds trust because as time goes by, participants learn that they can trust you because you stick to your weapons and respect the time of others by sticking to the plan. Thirdly, it gives people something to strive for the meeting not to be the best part of their day (it's a joke).5 Follow through. There are three types of people present at the meeting: those present, present, and those who take a place and breathe good air. Here are the differences: Those who are present actively listen and participate in topics. They think they are three or four steps ahead of the presenter at all times because they are results driven and strive to make an impact. Those who visit there because they should be, and will follow through with something only when asked them, but they are not as active as the first.
