The Gantt chart is a timetable that guides key steps of the project, both in terms of time and resources. Typically, the chart contains dates at the top and tasks down the left side of the document. The corresponding cell in which the task and date intersect is painted if the resource is scheduled to be used on that date. The advantage of the Gantt chart is that it's easy to see at first sight how many resources you'll need and when they'll be used. The diagram also gives an accurate estimate of the duration of the project. When you create and complete a Gantt chart, it can take time, it will be an invaluable tool throughout the project. Create a list of all the resources and tasks you need to complete a project. Resources can be in the form of the necessary personnel or equipment. Repeat until all the duration of the task is painted. Now you can see how long your project is expected to take. You can also use this information to identify areas where tasks can be shortened to save time and money. Try not to be too detailed with your tasks, otherwise the chart will become unreadable. Stick to headlines such as Plaster Wall instead of Plaster number 1, Plaster number 2, and so on. Henry Lawrence Gant, mechanical engineer and management consultant, invented the Gant chart in 1917. The Gantt diagram is a graphic representation of the duration of tasks that project managers use to plan and plan projects. The horizontal bars of the Gantt chart show the entire project time period, broken down into shorter increments of days or weeks. The vertical axis shows the tasks.
