## Hidden Garden Hugh Turvey

*Hidden Garden* is a scientific representation of flora, using the medium of x-ray imagery to highlight the hidden architectural structures within the subjects. Each image will cover a theme including sustainability, habitat, pollinators and medicinal, each captioned explaining either the science, research or statistics behind the image.

Set against the apt backdrop of Crossrail Place Roof Garden, the blown-up images allow visitors to engage with nature on a more intimate level, exposing just how fragile nature can be and how transparent it is that we should be acting against climate change.

Hugh Turvey is a contemporary pioneer of the x-ray art genre. Turvey is the first Artist in Residence at The British Institute of Radiology, Honorary Fellow of the Royal Photographic Society and recently delivered the annual Crookshank lecture for the Royal College of Radiologists.
