Alleluia Christ is Risen! Sing for joy that our Lord Jesus Christ is risen, and let us with meekness receive the implanted Word which is able to save our souls!

Rogate Sunday – The Latin names for the Sundays in Easter are from the first word of the Introit, with the exception of today. Rogate comes from the Latin *rogare* which means “to ask,” a reference to the strong theme of prayer in the Propers for today. In ancient practice, the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday prior to the Ascension of Our Lord were known as Rogation Days. These days of early summer were times of special prayer for the protection of the crops. The Introit for Rogate, “With a voice of singing, declare this with a shout of joy to the end of the earth.” is from Isaiah 48.20 a joyful proclamation of the freedom of Israel from the Babylonian captivity, and of God’s gracious deliverance of His people. The Gospel for Rogate, like those for the preceding Sundays—Cantate and Jubilate, all point to the Ascension, and point the eyes of the faithful to our risen Lord’s eternal reign in heaven. Cover Art – “*Saint Paul Preaching in Athens*” by Raphael, 1515. Raphael (1483-1520) is with daVinci and Michaelangelo the greatest of the High Renaissance artists. His work of *Saint Paul Preaching in Athens* where the Apostle proclaimed “Being then God's offspring, we ought not to think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of man. The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead” (Acts 17:29-31), invites us to be present as a listener as well. And so we listen to the preaching that that one man is Jesus Christ, our only mediator for our salvation and our prayers to our Father.

About the Hymn of the Day – Our Father, Who from Heaven Above– LSB 766

Early in the Reformation, Martin Luther was intent on providing hymns for congregations to sing, especially songs that would carry the biblical teachings and present the basics of the faith. By 1524, Luther himself had created a paraphrase of the Creed (“We all believe in one true God,” LSB 954), had supplied new stanzas for a Holy Communion Hymn (“O Lord we praise Thee” LSB 617), and had revised Jan Hus’s Lord’s Supper hymn (Jesus Christ, our blessed Savior,” LSB 627). His paraphrase of the Ten Commandments (“These are the holy Ten Commands,” LSB 851) was in use already in 1525. It was not until more than a decade later that he got the Lord’s Prayer and to a hymn on Baptism (“To Jordan Came the Christ, our Lord,” LSB 406). In his Lord’s Prayer hymn, Luther began each stanza with a rather literal version of the prayer (Matthew 6:13). The final stanza is on the Amen. Thus, the singer not only offers the prayer but also reviews its meaning. *Lutheran Service Book, Companion to the Hymns, Vol. 1. CPH, 2019, pp. 1121-1122.*
