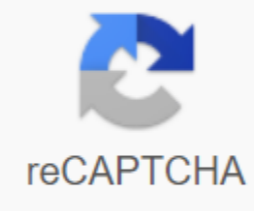




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Overview of montana statues requires an adult custody license through the Department of Health and Human Services. The rules for permissions are described in this profile. The Department of Health and Human Services provides adult day care under the Physical and Elderly Disability Waiver and Developmental Disability Waiver through a licensed provider. License Requirements and Certification definitions of adult childcare centers mean facilities, freestanding or connected to other health care facilities, which provide adults, regularly scheduled, with the care necessary to meet daily living needs but that do not provide overnight care. Parameters for Who Can Be Served Providers can serve frail, disturbed, or other disabled adults. No other provisions were identified. Inspection and Monitoring After receiving the application for a new license, the department must conduct an initial inspection within 45 days. Upon receiving the application for a license renewal, the department must inspect the facility without prior notice to the operator or staff. Regular licensing surveys are conducted every 1-3 years and are not announced. The duration of the license depends on the number and type of deficiencies found during the inspection, and if there are deficiencies related to the health, safety, and well-being of the population, a temporary license or 1-year license will be issued. In addition to its annual licensing inspections, the department may inspect any facility for compliance without prior notice to the facility's owners or staff. Necessary and Optional Terms of Service Regarding Medicines If the client is required to take the drug while at the center, the client should be able to take his own medicine, with the following assistance from the staff: (1) remind the client to take the drug at the appropriate time, (2) remove the drug container from storage, (3) help remove the cap, (4) guide the client's hand, and (5) observe the client taking the drug. Provisions for Groups with Staffing Requirements. Every adult daycare center must hire a manager. The Centre must at all times employ sufficient staff to provide the services required by the number and characteristics of its clients. Under the Administrative Code for Developmental Disabilities, adult service providers must employ staff who are experienced in providing services to people with developmental disabilities, especially to the elderly. Staffing ratio. At least one employee must be present at the center at all times where the client is present at the center. Orientation Training Requirements should include: (1) manual central policy and procedure overviews and presentations on how policies and procedures will be used and implemented; (2) employee work review (3) review of services provided by the facility; (4) simulated fire prevention, evacuation, and disaster training; (5) basic techniques of identifying and improving potential safety hazards at the facility; and (6) emergency procedures, such as basic first aid. Under the Administrative code for Developmental Disabilities, providers must provide training in first aid services, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), behavioral management, and other identified needs. Montana's Star Quality Childcare Rating System began operations in 2002; Inclusive and broad-based participatory review began in late 2007. The redesign process of The Stars became the country's strategic plan for all early care and education, not just subsidized childcare. The goal is for professional development and infrastructure support to help providers improve the quality whether they are officially registered with Bintang or not. Field tests of the new system began in June 2010. In May 2012, at the STARS event for directors, there was a unanimous vote to extend the field test. The Bureau of Early Childhood Services (ECSB) received additional unexpected funding in early 2013, enabling the planning and implementation of phase II for field tests. There are updates to the central matrix and family and group matrix for phase II. All changes and updates are directly generated from feedback and coaches, as well as information and data collected by the ECSB. Tje Tje The Star Quality System has three levels: license, one level above license, and national accreditation. The redesign focuses on adding incremental steps and increasing support to encourage participation. The newer Best Beginnings STARS to Quality system has five levels and includes the following: Research-based criteria workforce support through the Montana Early Care and Education Career Path, encouraging professional development along the Training Continuum Maintaining quality over time; extension based on level validation and monetary incentive program improvement plan for continuous program improvement based on the level of resources achieved and support to move through the levels provided by childcare resources and referral agencies, The Early Childhood Project, and other state-defined resource programs using the Pyramid Model incorporate the following program assessment tools as part of their training experience: Environmental Rating Scales (ERS), Program Scales and Business Administration (PAS and BAS), Social and Emotional Foundation Center for Early Learning (CSEFEL), Teaching Pyramid Observation Tool (TPOT), and Pyramid Toddler Observation Scale (TPITOS). Montana has long supported professional development with a registry of early childhood and school care and education practitioners and certain education certificates and support to achieve them, including scholarships and some form of achievement payments. In Best Beginnings STARS to Quality, management for all professional development services is located in one entity, the Montana Early Childhood Project (ECP), making it a one-stop shop for practitioners. All professional development is related to the early childhood knowledge base, and financial support rewards college-level certificates and courses. These include the Practitioner Registry Achievement and Renewal Award, the Professional Development Incentive Award and scholarships for Child Development Associate assessments, and accreditation through the National Association for The Education of Young People or the National Association for the Care of Family Children.
