MICRO CHIPPING

Microchipping is a procedure that implants a small, electronic chip under an animal's skin to identify it. The chip contains a unique code that can be scanned to match it with the owner's contact information

How it works

- A veterinarian implants the chip using a needle.
- The chip is about the size of a grain of rice.
- The chip is inserted between the shoulder blades of a cat or dog, or in the neck of a horse.
- The pet's body tissue bonds with the chip within 24 hours.

Benefits

- Microchips can help reunite lost or stolen pets with their owners.
- They can be used for international travel.
- They can be used with electronic pet doors.

What to do after microchipping

- Register the microchip's number with the appropriate agency (we do this for you if you opt in to microchip your pup)
- Keep your pet's registration information up to date.
- Ask your veterinarian to scan your pet's microchip at least once a year.

VARCEARES BARBONEL

Every SaltyDog will have had any necessary medical attention and vaccines to ensure they are feeling their best before they arrive with you.



ACCINES + MEDICAL 2

Depending on the age of the dog, they would have been administered one or multiple of the following vaccines before coming to you. If you are ever unsure, please refer to your SaltyDog Health Card or reach out to us to ask!

Triple

Canine Distemper Virus, Canine Adenovirus type 2, Canine Parvovirus

Quintuple

Canine distemper virus (indicated by the letter D), two types of adenovirus, aka hepatitis and kennel cough (named A, A2, or H), parainfluenza (P), and parvovirus (P).

Quintuple CV (Booster)

Preventive vaccine for canine distemper, canine infectious hepatitis, respiratory disease caused by adenovirus type 2, parainfluenza, parvovirus, coronavirosis and canine leptospirosis.

Sextuple

Canine Distemper, Canine Adenovirus Type 2 (CAV-2), Canine Coronavirus, Canine Parainfluenza and Canine Parvovirus Type 2b. Leptospirosis



FLIGHT DAY DETAILS WHAT TO EXPECT

WHAT'S APP group created between adopter/foster and flight team

Flight Day

Download flight tracker. A link will be provided in your group chat.

Pictures of flight angel and adopter will be swapped in group so that everyone knows who to look for at the destination.

Flight team will assist flight angels with check in at airport, and send pics of your pup at the airport before take off so you know they are on their way safely.

For those pups travelling **in cabin** they will go through security with the flight angel and stay with them every step of the way.

For those travelling in the **cargo hold**, the flight angels will go through security on their own, and the flight team will stay with the pup in the pet relief area until just prior to boarding- they will ensure they are loaded safely into their crate and sent to the plane.















FLIGHT DAY CHECKLIST WHAT TO BRING / PREPARE





Keep an eye on your WHAT'S APP flight group to be updated with flight details and arrival times



If your dog is travelling in cargo you will need scissors to open the crate

• Familiarize yourself with your local airport, and pet relief areas. Your new bestie is going to need a bathroom break before leaving the airport!



Don't forget to make sure you grab the medical and health card for your pup from the flight angel!







Dog food cannot travel with your pup so ensure you are preapared with food.
We suggest a mix of plain rice and boiled chicken to ease their tummies the first few days and slowly add in kibble or what you will be feeding them.



Set up a quiet and comfy place for your pup to decompress on their first night

HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR PUP

Patience

Be patient with your dog as they adjust.

Consistency Be consistent with your routine.

Positive Reinforcement

Use positive reinforcement to encourage good behavior.

Nutrition Provide high-quality food that's easy to digest.

Comfortable Safe Spaces Set up a crate or bed in a quiet area with treats and soft

bedding

<u>Perfect Puppy in 7 Days:</u> <u>How to Start Your Puppy Off Right</u>



FEEDING AND NUTRITION

You can give your dog nutritious treats in addition to their regular food. Lowcalorie treats include vegetables like broccoli, carrots, and zucchini, and fruits like bananas, apples, and melon. Choose a high-quality dog food that's appropriate for your dog's age, health, and life stage. You can also add variety to your dog's diet with raw or cooked meat, vegetables, or fish.

If you need to change your dog's food, do so gradually by mixing in a small amount of the new food with their regular food. Puppies under six months old should eat three or four meals a day, while adult dogs usually eat two meals a day.

You can check your dog's weight to make sure they're not eating too much or too little. When looking from the side, you should be able to feel but not see their last two or three ribs. The amount of food your dog needs depends on their breed, size, age, and activity level. A general guideline is to feed your dog 2–3% of their body weight, split into two or three meals. You can check the packaging of your dog's food for guidelines.
