EDITO

An artistic expression that is still little known to the general public, CONTEMPORARY JEWELLERY is a creative and innovative practice that translates into an almost systematic desire to experiment and break with the tradition of the discipline. Contemporary jewellery claims a hybrid identity drawing on art in all its forms, but also on design, architecture, fashion and technology. This transversality – or permeability – opens up the fields of possibility and allows creators to push back the limits of plastic research. Their creations play with codes, free themselves from aesthetic conventions and draw inspiration from the most diverse materials. Fascinating, sometimes disturbing, contemporary jewellery questions our bodies and our societies and instills new dreams and meanings to them.

Mostly unique pieces, contemporary jewellery is designed and handmade in a workshop. It is definitely artistic and often conceptual, and involves an approach linked to the personality of its creator.

THE CONCEPT

JEWELLERY WEEKS are flourishing in Europe and elsewhere, under different names, but always in connection with contemporary jewellery. There are currently about fifteen such events in Europe and more on other continents. Belgium, at the centre of the European Union, is now finally represented and destined to take a significant place.

The BRUSSELS JEWELLERY WEEK aims to celebrate contemporary jewellery and to highlight the know-how of Belgian designers, schools and institutions from the three regions of the country.







ZINNEKE: a word from the Brussels dialect meaning 'mongrel dog', but also a person or event resulting from a cultural mix. It is also the nickname given to the inhabitants of Brussels for their open, multicultural or cosmopolitan character.

We want a BJW that reflects Brussels: mixed, joyful, lively and full of self-mockery.

OBJECTIVES AND VALUES OF THE BJW

- To connect creators, galleries, schools, passionate collectors and the general public in the form of a quality biennial

- To give all artists professional, emerging or student the opportunity to try their luck by setting low participation fees compared to what is practiced elsewhere
- Make the event accessible through free exhibitions and guided tours.
- Make reasoned choices about the selection of materials and actions

EXHIBITION

"IN FIERI"

IN FIERI EXHIBITION AT MAD BRUSSELS

A major event of the Brussels Jewellery Week, the « In Fieri » exhibition takes place at MAD Brussels. The exhibition brings together 51 Belgian and international artists selected by an exceptional jury. The 124 works presented have been conceived and created from the perspective of « In Fieri », which means « in the making ».

The international call for entries (Open Call) is launched in October 2021 on social networks and websites dedicated to contemporary jewellery (Klimt02) and invites artists to create contemporary jewellery in relation to the theme « In Fieri ».

An independent jury of experts selects the works on the basis of the application file and the artist's portfolio. The selected works are exhibited at MAD Brussels, in the center of Brussels. Prizes are awarded to artists in various categories.

in fi·e·ri | \ ,in-'fē-ə-rē \ In Fieri: latin location which means "in the making"

Artists, through their sensitive, committed or experimental creations, participate in the evolution of society. And vice versa, all creation is a transformation of the material but also of the artist himself. We are constantly in the process becoming, on our way to another state of being, to a conclusion. The theme «In Fieri» is an invitation to become aware of the impermanence that surrounds us and to act, think, look and create with humility.





PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

The Open Call «In Fieri» 2022 is open to all: professional artists, students, emerging artists working in the field of jewellery and crafts as well as artists from other fields of art and design who focus on new ideologies and aesthetic visions of contemporary jewellery. Applicants from all countries and nationalities may participate. The work presented must be related to this year's theme: «In Fieri». Each participant may submit up to five works (individually or as part of a series). There are no restrictions regarding the materials, size and concept of the artworks. No «portability» is required, but there must be a connection to the body, whether formal, metaphysical or symbolic.

Teams of independent designers are allowed, but it is not possible to represent a brand name.

The Jury met in February 2022 for two days to review 252 entries from 37 countries. It selected 51 artists, coming from 22 countries, and chose the 124 works presented at MAD Brussels.

SCENOGRAPHY

On two levels, the 124 pieces presented are divided into five groups, each one evoking a different light on the notion of "In Fieri".

The scenography, designed by Marie Douel, leaves the spectator free to approach and appreciate the works presented. Here, there are no showcases or barriers, but rather a perception of pieces floating in a moving frame, enhanced by directed lighting, while the rest of the large exhibition room remains in relative darkness.

A total immersion in the world of contemporary jewellery, as much sculpture as jewellery, small and large, intimate and spectacular, composed of materials whose origin is often difficult to define, hence the questions and surprises!

As part of Brussels Jewellery Week, an exceptional venue is dedicated to the promotion of Belgian schools and academies focusing on contemporary jewellery: the Freddy Thielemans space at the Mont-de-Piété. This modern and luminous space, spread over two floors, is indeed ideal for showcasing jewellery.

For three days, from 29 April to May 1 2022, the Mont-de-Piété is hosting the Be.NEXT exhibition, which presents the work of students from the main Belgian jewellery schools.

For the first time in Belgium, this gathering of institutions, focused on contemporary jewellery, allows the public to discover the diversity and quality of the teaching provided in our country. It is also an opportunity for fruitful exchanges between schools, professors and amateurs.





PERFORMANCE "SLEEPING BEAUTY +"

LECTURES AND WORKSHOPS 4 Lectures 2 Workshops

30/4/22 Lectures in partnership with Vander A Observatory Jean-Marie Schaeffer (FR) & Larissa Cluzet THE JEWEL: A POWERFUL NARRATIVE CATALYST

As vectors of a relationship with memory, markers of the stages of our lives, jewellery carries memories, fragments of interpersonal stories. Beyond these historical or personal stories, jewels, by their mystery, also allows us to imagine all possible fictions. They stimulate discussion and are formidable vectors of narration.

Larissa Cluzet is a visual artist trained in art history, design, jewellery and fluid mechanics. Her practice explores materials as substances and narratives whose magic haunts the everyday life. She investigates how stories are told and kept silent, how materials make us.

Jean-Marie Schaeffer is a philosopher, specialist in aesthetics and art theory. He is director of research at the CNRS, director of studies at EHESS, and scientific director of the IRIS "Creation, cognition, society". He notably published Pourquoi la fiction? (Le Seuil, 1999), L'Expérience esthétique (Gallimard, 2015), Les troubles du récit (Thierry Marchaisse, 2020).



30/4/22 Lecture in partenariat with Vander A Observatory MATERIALEN VORMEN SIERADEN, by Saskia van Es (NL)

Man has always extracted raw materials from the earth, sometimes with ease and sometimes with greater difficulty. Man has also given meaning to these materials and used them in jewellery. Not all jewellery makers or wearers feel comfortable with all materials anymore. In her lecture, Saskia van Es describes when this discomfort first appeared in the art of jewellery. Will this growing ecological awareness, if it exists, change the face of contemporary jewellery?

Saskia van Es, art historian (Amsterdam, 1972) writes about contemporary jewellery for Dutch and international platforms such as Klimt02 and AJF. She teaches at Sint Lucas Antwerp, BE.

06/05/22 Creative Lunch in partenariat with MAD, Brussels Chequita Nahar (SR/NL)

The Creative Lunch is designed to showcase the creative minds of the fashion and design industry and their careers, ranging from their professional experience to inspiring advice for young creatives. This lunch is organized by MAD, in the framework of the Brussels Jewellery Week.

Chequita Nahar's jewellery is inspired by Surinamese culture, its traditions and the link with European culture or intercultural themes. Jewels where forms are inspired by traditions, where new customs and stories are integrated.

Chequita Nahar, born in Surinam, lives and works in Maastricht, the Netherlands. She studied jewellery design at the Maastricht Art Institute and completed her studies with a master's degree at the Sandberg Institute in Amsterdam (Rietveld Academy). She has worked as one of the designers

of L'Arcano, a Rome-based silver brand, on collections for fashion brands such as Alberta Ferretti and BORN. Her work is included in museums collections such as the Rijksmuseum, Museum Arnhem, Textile Museum, CODA, Gallery Marzee, the Alice and Louis Koch ring collection and other private collections. She is currently responsible for the program of the Fine Arts and Design departments (body, object, material).

07/05/22 Lecture in partenariat with I'Institut Jeanne Toussaint Daniella Saraya & Deganit Stern Schocken (IS) FIRE AND FLOOD: THE PERFORMATIVE SIDE OF MATERIALS

Daniella Saraya and Deganit Stern Schocken take us on a fascinating journey through the performative side of materials during a passionate workshop and lecture. Fire and flood are uncontrollable phenomena, manifesting a connection between matter and movement, a connection that creates great power. These types of extreme movements, which take place all over the world, are always followed by response movements such as flight, fear, protest, etc. In their connection with our body and language, fire and flooding can also become metaphors, describing an emotional experience, showing the expressive and performative possibilities of working with different materials. How do we choose materials for our work? To what extent are our thoughts, movements and emotions part of the material we use?



Daniella Saraya is an artist and curator, received her BA in Jewelry Design (2013) and her Master in Multidisciplinary Design (2017) at Shenkar College (Israel). In 2019 she started studying in the class of Prof. Karen Pontoppidan at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich. Over the past decade, she has been creating jewellery and jewellery-related projects, participating in exhibitions in Israel and around the world. Her work questions the boundaries of jewellery, focusing on its performative side and its connection to the body.

Deganit Stern Schocken is a jeweller, designer, artist, teacher and curator. She is the founder and head of the jewellery design department at Shenkar College of Engineering, Design and Art (1998 - 2007) and was also the chairperson of the Master of Design Program (M.Des) in Shenkar (2012-2016). Today, she is a lecturer in the M.Des programme and the jewellery design department.

Deganit Stern Schocken is a graduate of the Department of Industrial and Environmental Design of the Bezalel Art Academy (Jerusalem, IL) and holds a MFA from Middlesex University (London, UK). She has extensive experience in short and long term workshops in schools and conferences in Israel, Europe and elsewhere.

07/05/22 Workshop Xavier Maury (BE) JEWELLER IN FIERI? HOW TO CONCEIVE THE PROFESSION OF JEWELLER TODAY?

Through the testimony of his career in the world of jewellery, Xavier Maury proposes ways to better understand the new face of a multifaceted profession. He interacts with the audience and tries to answer the questions that people interested in the jewellery profession may have. Learning, creating, undertaking, designing, selling, passing on: these are all important themes that will be addressed during this round table, with, at the end of the day, the deciphering of the ins and outs of the jeweller's profession today.

Xavier Maury: after many years of scientific and then artistic studies, as well as an uneven life path, he started a jewellery training in Brussels in 2013. He obtained three diplomas in five years of study (jewellery, enamel, casting) and won the MAD Lookbook Award, Brussels in 2018. Since then, Xavier has created his own jewellery workshop and teaches jewellery at a professional training centre in parallel.




































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
