Programs and Workshops

The April General Meeting will include a display of six of the best quilts to be in the live auction at the Wonders of the Sea Tea and Quilt Auction on April 23rd. A talk about these quilts will be given by Lyn Brown. She will have pictures of the quilts prior to the meeting but she will be seeing the actual quilts for the first time on April 7th, at our general meeting. What will she say? Will she like them? Be sure to come and find out.

The April workshop will take place prior to the general meeting. (The Saturday after our general meeting, the usual time for the workshop, is "Meet the Teachers" at Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds.)

Caroline Carpenter is presenting her Zoom workshop on "Designing Foundation Paper Pieced Patterns" April 2nd. Since we will not be having an in-person meeting before that time, you can only sign up for this workshop on the website. You should be familiar with the basics of paper piecing or have attended Caroline's previous workshop in March. You can learn how to convert traditional blocks into paper pieced blocks for very accurate piecing or convert your favorite photograph into a paper pieced quilt. If you attended Caroline's March workshop you will already know how easy it is to follow Caroline's step by step teaching methods. **Cost is \$25 for Acacia or QBS members**

The May workshop is with David Owen Hastings, also by Zoom. The title of the workshop is "Inspired by Architecture" and will feature a small, quilt-as-you-go project. David is a popular and highly acclaimed Modern quilter. Don't miss this chance to attend his workshop. **Cost is \$35 for Acacia or QBS members, \$75 for others**

The June workshop will be a free, in-person workshop, instructed by Barbra, based on Michele Crawford's concept of quilting with scraps and (surprise, surprise) we will be using fabric from the storage unit. The workshop will be June 4th at the senior center, and we will continue with the same projects the following Saturday at Fabricators.



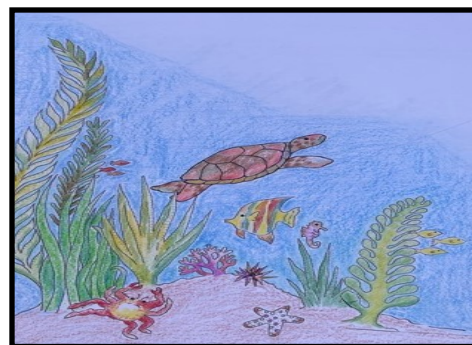

The Wonders of the Sea Tea and Quilt Auction is getting close! Just a few more weeks to get the final plans in place.

The quality of the quilts this year is exceptional! Our auctioneer, Sonia, prefers to keep the live auction quilts to 33 or less, due to the time involved for the auction. This year we tried to stay within that number, but 35 quilts was the best we could do. The silent auction also has nice quilts that in other years would be in the live auction. Plus, we now have several quilts available for the "request for a quilt to auction" we sometimes get from other non-profit groups.

The six quilts we think will bring in the highest auction prices will be on display at the April general meeting. Even if you are unable to come to the tea on April 23rd, be sure to come to the April general meeting to see the wonderful work to be displayed at the Wonders of the Sea Tea and Quilt Auction. As Sonia commented, "we have made it to the big time"!

The Tea and Quilt Auction in 2019 had a few bottleneck areas that we think are now solved for this tea. First, buying tickets for the basket drawing has been simplified and second, payment for quilts won at the live auction can be made during the auction. That should eliminate the long line to pick up quilts at the end of the auction.

The last general "Tea" meeting is March 24th by Zoom. There may be additional smaller meetings of those doing specific jobs. For example, those taking credit card payments will be getting together to make sure everything works as it should.

Baskets for the Tea are scheduled to be completed on April 16th at Marianne's house. If you are contributing a basket or have items for a basket watch the Blast for details.

If you plan to help at the tea itself, you will probably receive a call to verify the job you have volunteered to help. A quilt auction is always fun and this one should be the best yet!

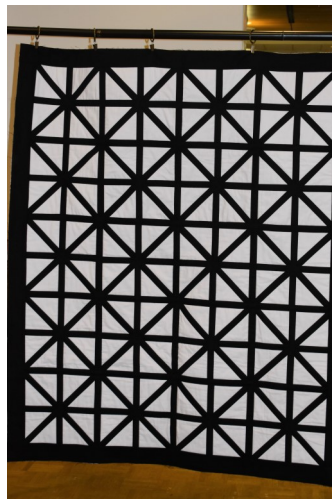

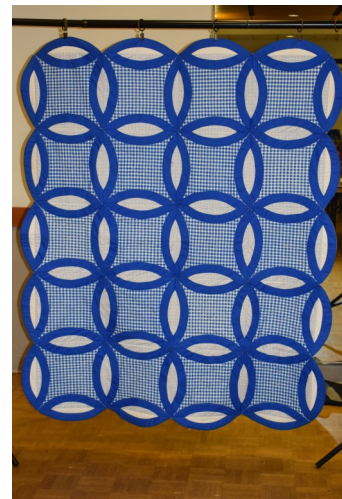

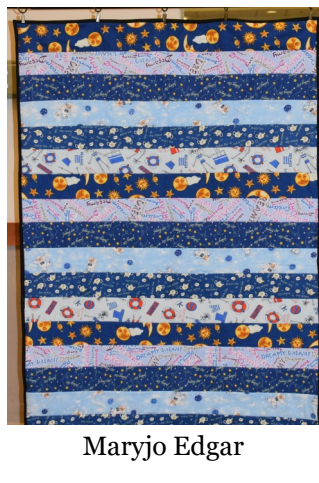

It's time to renew your membership. You may submit your 2022-2023 membership renewal and pay your dues through the Guild website. As a reminder, here are the steps for website renewal:

- Go to the website: www.acaciaquiltguild.org/join-us .
- Scroll down to the Membership Application / Renewal form. Complete the form (make sure you fill in all of the boxes).
- Click Next Step to take you to the payment page.
- When the window titled, Full Year 2022/23 Acacia Membership opens, choose whether you would like to receive your newsletter digitally (email) or mailed (USPS). The cost of your membership will be updated based on which option you select. Once you have selected, click, Buy Now.
- When the window titled, Contact Info / Overview, opens, confirm that you have selected the membership option correctly, choose a Payment Method then click, Purchase.
- Enter your credit or debit card details to pay your membership dues, then click, Pay.

When you have submitted and paid your dues, a message will pop up thanking you for your order and you will receive an Order Confirmation email from the system.

An Order Completion email will be sent when an Acacia Board Member processes your enrollment and updates the guild roster with your information.

Thank you, Acacia members, for all of your kindness and generosity!

On February 26-27, 2022, Acacia Quilt Guild members gathered together to make quilts for the *San Carlos Apache Indian Reservation* in Arizona.

Please see the photographs of the final quilts/donations and the sewing weekend.

There is a lot of poverty on the *Reservation* and many children sleep several to a bed or several on a mattress if there is no bed in the home. *In The Gap Ministries* has created a project where they collect monetary donations to build wooden bed frames and also purchase mattresses. The project also teaches carpentry skills to *Reservation* members to help them find work in the future.

Knott Avenue Christian Church (KACC) collected funds to make 40 beds. Acacia Guild Vice-President Phyllis Campbell attends this church (as do some other Acacia members) and suggested that Acacia could donate pillowcases and quilts for these new beds. She brought the proposal to the Philanthropy Committee and it was decided to hold a sewing weekend.

Acacia donated the following:

48 quilts & blankets (crocheted, fleece, flannel)

275 pillowcases

17 brand new baby outfits

Lots of diapers

The pillowcases and quilts were distributed along with 40 wooden bed frames that were built at the *Reservation* by volunteers during the last week of March.

- e. **Treasurer:** The Treasurer maintains accurate books of all AQG financial transactions. **Caroline Carpenter** will take on this very important role.

- p. Website Chairperson—**Caroline Carpenter** will continue maintaining the AQG website.

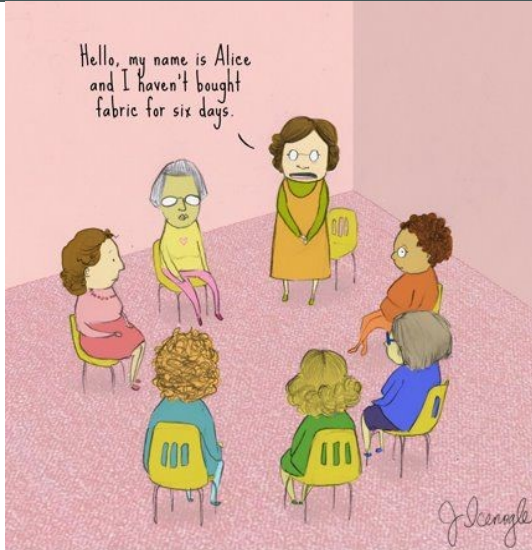

BOARD REPORT OF MARCH 17TH

San Carlos 'Quilt-As-You-Go' Project - 'Thank You' to all members who participated in the making of the 'Quilt-As-You-Go' quilt project for the San Carlos Apache Reservation. We delivered 48 quilts and blankets, 275 pillowcases, 17 baby outfits, diapers, and other supplies to the delivering organization today in time for their trip on Saturday.

Google Workspace - The Board approved the use of Google Workspace, an organizational tool that enhances group productivity through use of collaboration tools, using shared calendars, email invites, and video conferences, among other features.

Tea & Quilt Auction - All tickets have been sold and there are 4 people on the wait list. All tables have been assigned a hostess. Phone calls to finalize details will be made this week. The next tea meeting will be in person on Thursday, March 24th. General membership will be notified if this meeting is in-person or via Zoom. Basket wrap day will be announced later in the month.

Print on Demand Items to Boutique - The Board approved purchasing a variety of items from the Print on Demand shop on the website to sell at the Tea & Auction Boutique, not to exceed a purchase amount of \$300.

Newsletter - The deadline for items to be included in the Newsletter is Monday, March 21, 2022. A proofreader for the newsletter has been requested.

SCCQG - Lori Ramsey. - Next meeting will be on April 9, 2022 and will feature the Meet the Teachers event. L. Ramsey and B. Riley will be attending for Acacia.

Phyl's Place will meet on March 29th, 2022, at 2:00 PM, to evaluate kits and needs for other projects. There are 100 Christmas stockings completed and ready.

Membership - There are 43 members; one new member joined this month. Membership renewals are in process via the website, or visit the website to download and print an application to mail to the Guild P.O. Box.

Workshops -

The April 2nd Workshop is a follow-up to the March class and will be a skill-building session entitled, Designing Foundation Paper Pieced Patterns (Cost: \$25 to members, \$50 to non-members, time: 10 to 3).

The May 7, 2022, Workshop is Inspired by Architecture presented by David Owen Hastings (Cost: \$35 to members, \$75 to non-members, time: 9 to 3). Sign-ups for all workshops are via the website. Mr. Hastings' workshops are very popular and the general membership should be encouraged to sign up early via the website as soon as possible before registration is opened to non-members.

Quilt Rack Donation - The Board voted to accept the donation of a Quilt Rack.
