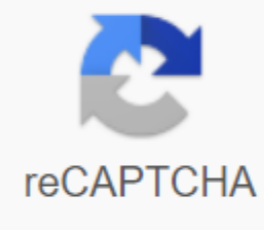

Their appeal to the public comes after charity scientists and volunteers failed to control the controls sites due to social distance restrictions. Records of Britain's beautiful butterflies will be severely affected this spring, but there are hopes that if everyone works together, insect data can still be collected. Want to help? BrimstoneCommaSpeckled WoodHolly BlueOrange-tipRichard Fox, deputy director of recording and research, said on its website: Exploring the changing flight time and location of butterfly species across the UK is vital to understanding the impacts of climate change on our native wildlife. This spring we will have a gap in our phenology data as our scientists and volunteers fail to carry out their usual monitoring in nature reserves and across rural Britain. If you live in certain areas, especially in the north of England and in Scotland, we are particularly interested in your observations, as all these butterflies spread northwards, colonizing areas where they have not occurred before. The comma, for example, has spread hundreds of miles north since the 1970s. Just this week we got a sighting from a garden in Fife, which was the first comma that a volunteer saw there in 60 years. Going for a walk this week? Why not grab the camera and watch out for the beautiful butterflies, leaning on the floral heads. See how they look below... At the end of the ceremony, some of Mary's sisters handed out envelopes to people sitting in the aisles. When Gambet's father gave his word, the guests were told to open the envelopes. When Mary and Lou smiled and walked down the aisle, the monarch butterflies took off and left the envelopes! People cried tears of joy! Late last summer, we had a family dinner outside on the restaurant patio. It was raining and my 8 year old granddaughter was wandering down to the pool. She found a rain-soaked butterfly that could not fly. She carefully took it, put it in her hand, and brought it back to show us. Like a mother taking care of her beloved child, she tried to bring him back to health. When we left the restaurant, she carefully showed it to many of our friends who had dinner there. They were fascinated. The next day, I went to a party attended by quite a few of the same friends. Very excited, the first thing they asked: How is a butterfly? I said, He's still alive! And this beautiful world is ours, alive and increasingly precious every moment. Let the butterfly remind us to appreciate all our blessings in life and to stay close to the love and care of the fragile world around us.
