Made entirely from plant materials, the Bearaby Tree Napper is a hand-knitted weighted blanket designed to soothe the body, providing a deep touch pressure. But how does it work, and is it worth the dough? Keep reading to find out! Bearaby Tree Napper is a great choice for those looking for an eco-friendly weighted blanket! The SnapshotBearaby brand was created with one mission in mind - to provide weighted bedding that are kind to the environment. In fact, this company sells exceptionally weighted blankets and comforters, all of which are made from natural, sustainable materials. Even the packaging is made of recycled fabric! Bearaby offers a variety of weighted bedding options, but, in this review, we're focused on Tree Napper. So follow along as I explore this Earth friendly blanket because it may just be the dream accessory you dreamed of. What is the Bearaby Napper tree made of? I'll be honest - Bearaby Tree Napper doesn't look like any weighted blanket I've tested (and I've checked quite a lot, including the super popular Gravity Blanket). It's a hand-knitted and has a wide loop weave that, when I first saw it, made me wonder: Where is the weighted material and what makes this blanket heavy? Let's take a closer look. A close-up look at bearaby Tree Napper! Material: TencelFrom from top to bottom, this blanket is made from one material - Tencel.Some of you may already be familiar with Tencel as I reviewed a ton of Tencel-based sheets, but it's actually a trademark name for lyocell. Lyocell is a sustainable material made from wood pulp eucalyptus trees (hence the name Tree Napper), and it is known for its super smooth feel. I'm a big fan of Tencel because it's breathable and naturally moisture wicking, which is perfect for us hot sleepers. But what I find most interesting about Tree Napper is that it is not filled with any weighted material. Weighted blankets are usually made of sewn chambers, which are filled with plastic pellets, glass beads or patented weighted material. Bearaby Tree Napper is made entirely of Tencel.Every weighted blanket I tested was either glass beads or plastic pellets, but the tree napper gets its weight from layer by layer of fabric based on wood (and I think, think, pretty cool). Bearaby Tree Napper is a great choice for those looking for an eco-friendly weighted blanket! Weave: Hand-Knit Wide Loop WeaveFirst that you will probably notice about Tree Napper is that it looks like it was woven by hand, and that's because it was! The people at Bearaby treat the yarn as solid, chunky, and delightfully heavy, and I would say that's an accurate description. For me, the hand-knitted look of this blanket reminds me of the big ol' sweater that you can wear in Autumn.It important note, however, that this blanket has a wide weave cycle. This means that there are open spaces between each piece of yarn and you can kind of tug and stretch individual layers of Tencel.The Tree Napper is hand-knitted for better airing. While some may prefer a traditional design (stitched into chambers filled with weighted material), this hand-knitted design promotes more airflow through the fabric, making it more breathable. Weight options: 15, 20, 25 poundsI'm testing 15 pounds Tree Napper, but there are 20 and 25 pounds options available as well. If you're wondering how to choose the weight that's best for you, it's actually pretty simple. Just choose the weight that is closest to 10 percent of your own body weight. For example, if you're 150 pounds, go with a 15 pound blanket. Read more: Check out my guide to collecting the best weighted blanket for you! I'm less than 150 pounds, but it's best to go with a blanket that's just over 10 percent of your body weight to make sure you still benefit from the healing properties of deep-touch pressure. Remember - deep touch pressure is used to help calm the body down and prepare for sleep (more on that later!). For me, the pressure of this blanket feels comparable to the other blankets I've experienced, and I don't feel that this hand-knitted design has made it less effective. And because there is no artificially weighted material inside the Napper tree, it is completely silent as you never hear glass or plastic beads ringing together. Rest under the weight of Bearaby Tree Napper! Bottom line: Soft, Breathable, Eco-FriendlyIf you're looking for a soft, eco-friendly weighted blanket that feels like a chunky sweater, it might be perfect for you. The Napper tree is made entirely of wood fabric, and is not filled with any artificial materials. Not to mention, this wide weave cycle promotes large air-thrates that can be ideal for people who work hot. What does Bearaby Tree Napper feel like? Good sleepers, now that we know exactly what this blanket is made of, let's talk more about how it looks, feels and go to some basics about deep touch pressure. See, FeelBefore I'm talking about how the Tree Napper feels, I have to take a moment to recognize its unique look. I check this blanket in a deep pink color called hibiscus, but it is also available in Lavender and Mai Lily (which is ivory). However, it's worth noting that the color on the site is brighter than the blanket itself, and looks more crimson than pink. Although not everyone will be in these colors, I find them beautiful and attractive. Also, I think that the hand-knitted look of this blanket brings something special to the world of weighted blankets, and I've never seen another like it. Meanwhile, the wide loop weave contributes to the flow of air through the blanket, making it quite breathable and cool. A common complaint about weighted blankets is that they are too warming, and heat distracts from the therapeutic benefits of blankets. If you can relate to this, Tree Napper may be for you. Bearaby Tree Napper is soft, breathable and environmentally friendly. However, people are looking specifically for a weighted accessory that is going to keep them warm and cozy, you might want to look elsewhere. I tend to work hot, so I like the cool and fresh quality of this blanket. And make no mistake - Tencel is super smooth and this blanket feels very soft on the skin. Verdict: Eco-friendly people looking for a soft and breathable weighted blanket should definitely give this a try! Should I Bearaby Tree Napper? Bearaby Tree Napper is a great choice for those looking for an eco-friendly weighted blanket! Now that Took a close look at this blanket, let's summarize the highlights so you know if it's best for you: Eco-Friendly - It's all a blanket made from wood pulp from eucalyptus trees. If you're looking for weighted bedding made entirely from natural materials, Tree Napper is a great option. Personally, I really like that there are no artificial materials in this blanket at all. Hand knit and breathing - The hand-knitted look of this blanket gives it a unique style that some may prefer to the traditional weighted design of the blanket. In addition, the wide loop weave promotes a lot of airing through the blanket, which can be especially beneficial for those who work hot. Wash Care - One of my favorite things about this blanket is that it's machine washes and dries (making it the first weighted blanket I've ever tested that it's not stain-clean only). Just use a cool gentle loop with a mild detergent and then fall dry over low heat. Keep in mind, however, that it can take more than one dry cycle to dry it completely. Bearaby Tree Napper comes in hibiscus, lavender, and May Lily,Bearaby Tree Napper Complaints Of course, there are a few things about this weighted blanket that some may consider flawed: Not very warm - not everything will be in the open weave loop going on here, and some may find that they prefer a more traditional weighted blanket that is filled with glass beads or plastic pellets. If you are looking for something a little warmer or insulating, you can shop around before deciding on it. Colors - Although I like the color options that come with this blanket, keep in mind that they are all inspired by flowers and have light, quite aesthetic. If lavender, hibiscus and May Lily don't blend in with your personal style, this is something to consider. Expensive - If you spent any time shopping for a weighted blanket, you probably found out they were quite expensive. And in the range of \$250-\$280, this blanket is no exception.
