**Principals' Report - SSES** KFS reflected on the recent Back to School night. Wondered if there needed to be a Whole School assembly. Had expected overflow attendance and there were some seats unfilled. A Back to School night survey went out to parents and those with students in Special Ed program were pleased with presentations. Some criticism that the event started too early. Banning cell phones/smart watches seems to be resonating with students and parents as there has only been one incident of a student bringing in a smartwatch. . Two new staff members have been hired since August: an additional math paraeducator and a cafeteria supervisor. Nursing assistant has resigned. Announced an upcoming presentation of Screenagers, in conjunction with HKMS, which dovetails nicely with both school initiatives for education surrounding the effects of technology and device usage on student populations.

**Principals' Report - HKMS** Dr. Clapp had attended Crisis Training and stressed the importance of how the district responds to events but also the prevention. Related how social media exposure is one of the top risks for mental health. Felt Screenagers showing will be vital in helping spread the message to student guardians. Spoke of the importance of play and even boredom. Dr. Clapp mentioned that top companies now cite that they are looking for leaders and employees with "soft skills" such as empathy. Screens and social media usage seem to work against the building of soft skills. Dr. Clapp thanked Stoppa Landscaping for the planters outside of school.

Special Guest - Sarah Scrofan, Assistant Superintendent for Finance, Operations, and Technology Spoke about how the district uses educational tech tools and going back to school with technology. Chromebooks are used in K-\* and they provided a great opportunity for personal learning. Google Classrooms allow teachers to streamline workflow into one space all students can access. Students are automatically enrolled for ease of use. Parents should be encouraged to ask their student to show them their Google Classroom for each subject. It is important that students realize tech isn't just for entertainment but it is an important tool. Mentioned that teachers implement GoGuardian, which directs students only to the sites and resources approved by the teacher. Teachers can also see what students are working on. A number of web resources were shared including a site for Digital Wellness, Digital Citizenship and Commonsense Media. Also spoke about how AI effects education and stressed the importance of teachers and parents modeling how to use AI as a tool to complement learning, not replace learning. Finds asking students "Is this replacing or enhancing my learning" to be a vital framework to build the best usage practices. Dr. Clapp mentioned how the 8th grade capstone project does allow the use of AI for some components. A google doc form was provided if any attendees had any further questions.
