The Blessings of Weekly Worships



Right in the beginning when Israel became a nation, God gave them the 10 Commandments. These formed the foundation of their faith. Among these 10 commandments was the command to remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy.

Why is it so important for God's people to remember the Sabbath to keep it holy? Chiefly because of the blessings that come from weekly worship.

Take for example a family who upholds the Lord's day with respect and importance. It is the main event for the family and no one makes any plans other than worship on Sunday. Here, you will find a healthy family, growing in the fear of the Lord and reaching out to their friends with the love of Jesus.

It is so easy to allow family and friends to distract us. Even good things like family dinners and children's birthdays. If others observe that we are not serious about the Sunday worship, they will even drop by to visit you knowing you would rather entertain them than worship God.

During the pandemic, many borderline Christians are taking a backseat as far as their faith is concerned. Since they do not need to get ready and dressed up for worship, many fall into these bad habits relating to live streaming.

1. Instead of getting together before the hour, some wait until 6pm, and then try to find the link. This is so because I keep getting texts from people after 6pm asking for the link to the live streaming.

2. Joining in the live streaming after 6pm. The direct link to our live streaming is posted before Sunday on the website and Facebook group. Test it out on your TV or phone and be ready to start with us at 6pm. Do not try to look for the Facebook video as brother Barnabas will post it only after 6pm.

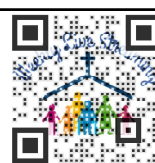
3. When you view the live streaming, keep in mind that you are participating in a worship with others all over Singapore. Have the communion kit ready with the envelope for contribution. Please do not enjoy snacks or indulge in conversation.


The Hebrew writer warns the Christians in Hebrews 10:25-27 to *not forsaking our own assembling together, as the custom of some is, but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as you see the Day approaching. For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remains no more a sacrifice for sins, but a certain fearful expectation of judgment, and a fierceness of fire which will devour the adversaries.*

Every worship can bless our lives and increase our strength and Christian growth. Imbibe the spirit of the Psalmist in Psalms 122:1 - *I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the LORD.*

When Can We Assemble Again?



As the number of Covid-19 infections continue to drop, there has been an easing of restrictions, especially since phase 3 is just around the corner. We are in touch with the Metropolitan YMCA and here are the latest update.

1. Under current safe distancing regulations, the Upper Room can only seat up to 36 persons.
2. No singing is allowed and worship services must be as short as possible.
3. There will be no mingling before and after the service.

On top of these physical restrictions, the Household of Faith must be registered under the Registrar of Societies.

We also need to apply for a Letter of Approval from the Crisis Preparedness for Religious Organisations (CPRO).

Also, all worshippers are to download and activate the TraceTogether app.

We will see if any of the above regulations will be lifted in the coming weeks.

With the current onerous requirements just to assemble together for an hour and disperse without any fellowship, we will wait for the next phase to open.

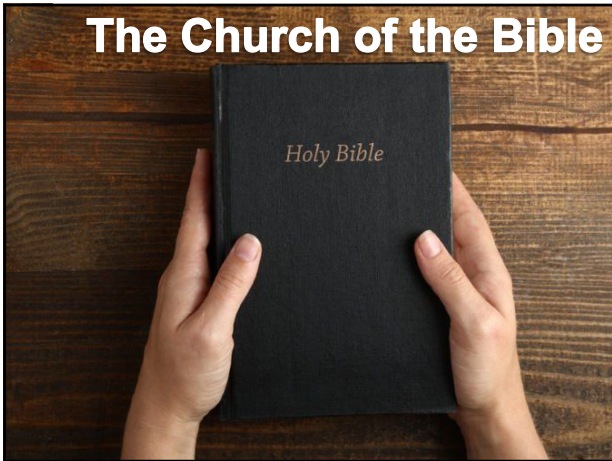

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Introduction

So many churches; so easy to be confused

In general we find churches grounded on tradition, its founder or particular doctrines

Even churches which claim to be based on the Bible can be off-base

Tonight I want to share with you 7 things about the church of the Bible



1. The church of the Bible had no name

Churches today have many different names

- named after apostles
- by their denomination
- even by their mission

The church of the Bible did not have a proper name

Often it has been called the body of Christ

Sometimes, House of God

Once referred to as churches of Christ

Usually identified by the location e.g. 7 churches of Asia (Revelations 3)

Each congregation was autonomous

Mature churches were led by their elders
1 Timothy 5:17 *Let the elders who rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in the word and in teaching.*

Advantage – self examination, become closer to the Bible

Acts 17:11 *Now these were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of the mind, examining the Scriptures daily to see whether these things were so.*

Revelation 22:18-19 *I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book, if anyone adds to them, may God add to him the plagues which are written in this book. Creed books were designed to help, but ended teaching differently from Bible

- if more; wrong
- if less; wrong
- if same; why not just use the Bible

Psalms 111:9 *He sent redemption unto his people: he hath commanded his covenant for ever: holy and reverend is his name.*

1 Timothy 4:3 *forbidding marriage and commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and know the truth.*

1 Corinthians 12:12-13 *For as the body is one, and has many members, and all the members of the body, being many, are one body; so also is Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether bond or free; and were all given to drink into one Spirit.*

When you obey the gospel, you are added into the church Acts 2:41 *Then those who gladly received his word were baptized. There were added that day about three thousand souls.*

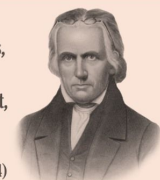

Below is the latest correspondence that we have received from the Metropolitan YMCA.

Although the government has relaxed the parameters and allowed up to 100 persons for a worship service, we are still bound by this clause, "From 3 October 2020, all ROs will be allowed to conduct congregational and other worship services for up to 100 persons, subject to safe distancing and safe management measures in place." (<https://www.moh.gov.sg/news-highlights/details/resuming-more-activities-safely>)

Because of this, we can only allow 36 persons at the Upper Room due to the safe distancing measures as indicated in the advisory.

I know you are eager to resume your gathering as much as we are excited to welcome you back, however, we would require the following documents first to be submitted or prepared as a response to the requirements of the government.

Letter of Approval from the Crisis Preparedness for Religious Organisations (you may apply through this link: <https://www.form.gov.sg/5eeb1acc5a361100119ea96f>)

Worship Programme Flow- Appoint a Safe Management Officer to assist in the implementation and coordination of the system of Safe Management Measures. Kindly provide his/her name, contact number and e-mail address.

Encourage all worshippers, religious workers and staff to download and activate the TraceTogether App.

Display a dedicated SafeEntry QR code at the registration desk at all times.

Implement health checks and protocols by providing your own sanitizers and temperature checker at the registration desk.

Few reminders to follow:

Worshippers have to observe 1 metre safe distance between others.

Keep worship service to as short a duration as possible.

All attendees must wear a face mask at all times.

Singing and other live performances are not permitted during the worship service.

There should be no sharing of prayer and other common items.

Lastly, here are the terms and conditions that we would like to implement as part of this exercise:

The organizer takes full responsibility in ensuring that all rules and regulations set by the government are followed and implemented accordingly. (You may refer to this link: <https://www.cpro.gov.sg/resources/advisories/>)

The organizer waives all liabilities from Metropolitan YMCA Singapore should there be deviations from any of the default parameters set by the government.

Metropolitan YMCA may decide on its sole and absolute discretion to halt any services should there be found any violations against the safety protocols of the government.

Our Hope is based on the Ressurrection of Christ



Two disciples were returning from Jerusalem with their heads hung low and sadly making their way home to Emmaus. As they discribed with disbelief how their Master, Jesus was crucified, they were confused as they lost hope in their Messiah, thinking His death is the end of their faith.

A stranger joined them on their journey and asked what they were discussing. When night fell, they invited their companion to a meal before they part ways.

Luke 24:32 tells us that these two *finally recognised Jesus and "said one to another, "Weren't our hearts burning within us, while he spoke to us along the way, and while he opened the Scriptures to us?"*

Instead of continuing on their journey to Emmaus, Luke 24:33-35 tells us that *"they rose up that very hour, returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven gathered together, and those who were with them... They related the things that happened along the way, and how he was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread."*

What a difference the ressurection of Jesus made! Instead of returning home and abandoning all hope, they returned to Jerusalem to join the remaining disciples!

As we read the New Testament, Jesus died but rose on the third day. For 50 days, the Bible records the appearances of Jesus until he was taken to heaven in the presence of His apostles.

Because all the apostles were eye witnesses to the ressurection of Jesus, they preached the

gospel boldly and fearlessly. If we know for certain that Jesus rose from the dead, why should any of us be afraid to die?

Most assuredly, we say with Hebrews 13:6, *"so that with good courage we say, "The Lord is my helper. I will not fear. What can man do to me?"*

Our hope is based on the ressurection of Christ. Here is how the apostle puts it in 1 Corinthians 15:12-19:

"Now if Christ is preached, that he has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, neither has Christ been raised.

"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, and your faith also is in vain. Yes, we are found false witnesses of God, because we testified about God that he raised up Christ, whom he didn't raise up, if it is so that the dead are not raised.

"For if the dead aren't raised, neither has Christ been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then they also who are fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If we have only hoped in Christ in this life, we are of all men most pitiable."

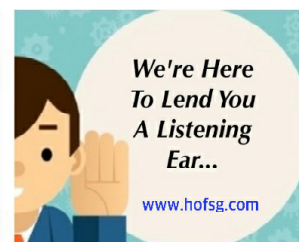

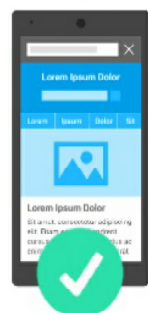
