Some sites, such as Powell, will not accept books with certain flaws, such as any writing in them, so follow these guidelines. Be honest and accurate in your descriptions. If you have a few books to sell, you don't want negative reviews from disgruntled customers. If you have something really valuable to sell, such as the first edition of Po or Mark Twain, it might be worth getting it appreciated. In addition, you can search for similar copies already for sale online. Abe Books has a search service that you can use to find relevant books and see what they are currently selling.
