Location update for public meeting offered for Rock Springs draft Resource Management Plan

Rock Springs, WY – The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) encourages the public to participate in public meetings discussing the Rock Springs Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Resource Management Plan (DEIS/RMP). The three meetings will offer opportunities to learn more about the plan, the EIS process, and submit written comments. These meetings will be an open house, informational format with written comment opportunities for the public The 90-day public comment period began on Aug. 18 and will conclude Nov. 16, 2023.

to balance opportunities to use and develop BLM-administered resources with environmental conservation.

Western Wyoming Community College Receives Grant to Provide Training in Operating Drones



Western strives to be a leader when responding to the demands of Wyoming's thriving industries. Using drones in business and industry can help companies save time on inventory checks, inspect facilities, take aerial photos of properties, and much more.

Drones, also known as by FAA Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), are the future for of business and industry. Drones can easily reach places that are challenging or dangerous for humans to access. Areas in which drones can be utilized for maintenance/inspection include high-rise buildings, bridges, and massive wind turbines. Drones drastically decrease workplace injuries and fatalities; however, business and industry need someone to operate them. This need is going to be an ongoing need, and in fact, the total potential for drone

usage has yet to be determined in relation to our workforce.

If you think of how a drone can be used instead of a human, a drone is equipped with high-resolution cameras and sensors that are used to scan a bridge for structural issues. It's doing this with minimal human intervention, drastically reducing the risk factor and manpower associated with manual inspections. Drone usage is not only just safer, but it has also been shown to be much quicker and the accuracy is more precise.

This grant will be used to implement a Drone Program in an effort to fulfill Wyoming's demand for expanding industry access to safer maintenance and accessibility of their properties and infrastructure. This program will help provide a workforce with the additional skills to do this work in a safe, precise, and efficient manner. It is the intent to develop a program that would meet the training needs of all companies and other industries in Wyoming, taking into consideration that different companies may have slightly different staffing and skill requirements for the education and usage of drones. Expanding the number of technicians who have the ability to operate and maintain drones.

Expanding the number of technicians who have the ability to operate and maintain drones will help Wyoming industries with a variety of safety and maintenance concerns, help with livestock management and agriculture, real estate, etc. This skill will help meet the demand of the current workforce and expand career opportunities for H3 jobs in Wyoming.

Our instructor, Dr. Karen Lackey, has her remote pilot license. Dr. Lackey grew up in Oregon and attended the University of Oregon to earn a BA in Political Science. After graduation, Dr. Lackey moved to Texas to work in the energy industry. With several years of corporate experience, she returned to academia to earn

an MEd in Instructional Technology at the University of Houston. With her teaching certificate, she taught K-12 technology classes in Montana, Europe, and the Middle East. While working internationally, Dr. Lackey attended California State University, East Bay, and earned an MS in Online Teaching and Learning. After 12 years overseas, she returned to Texas to attend the Doctoral Program at the University of North Texas. Dr. Lackey earned a Ph.D. in Learning Technologies in 2019. Her doctoral research involved identifying the factors that parents consider when enrolling a child in an online K-12 school. Dr. Lackey's experience and research focus on technology integration in the classroom and online learning. At Western, she teaches Classroom Management, Foundations of Education, and Teaching with Technology courses. She is very excited to provide this new opportunity to business and industry.

LaBarge captures between 6 and 7 million metric tons of CO2 per year, which is nearly 20% of all CO2 captured in the world annually.

Our CCS expansion plans at LaBarge will capture an additional 1 million metric tons of Co2, bringing ExxonMobil's total global capture capacity of CO2 to about 10 million metric tons per year.

The LaBarge expansion project will require around \$400 million in investment. We anticipate it will create some 400 jobs during construction and add another 10-15 long-term roles to our employee base of 200.
