Should I buy a white sofa pottery barn? I'm sure most of you who follow my blog know that I've been busy with my couch dilemma. so here's the scoop I'm in the market to replace our old wear, uncomfortable, not in style... Sofa. Can you say I want to have a new sofa? so, not sure you know my little secret, but, I'll research the project to death and I'll get to the point where I suffer from analysis, paralysis! I started this adventure with a mentality that I wouldn't be too involved in research, and because in the end, I wanted a slipcover sofa and a slick issue could be solved with a wash cycle. Well, the whole process snowballed and I'm now experiencing a white blizzard in my head. I don't know which way up or down and I haven't narrowed my choice all that much. So, I did one thing... I took a pottery barn swatches and reluctantly put stains on three white fabrics and then I washed them by hand with cold water. what followed was the information that was eye-opening for me so in this blog I share my experiences and results. I am proud that I conducted my own scientific project and it was all driven by my crazy obsessive personality! Ok... enjoy reading and I hope my journey is interesting and helpful. Details of my little study: 1. 3 ceramic barn slipcover swatches (not sure if they have a scotch guard applied) - performance canvas white (100% polyester) - washed flaxy cotton white (55% underwear, 45% cotton) - twill white (100% cotton) 2 cotton. stains and black pen - vegetable oil, chocolate and dirt lipstick I've been soaping a pottery shed, Ikea and custom slipcovers for years, and that's how I do it... Step 1 - While the slipcover is still on the couch, do any treatment place with a little detergent and a toothbrush if you need to. Step 2 - Remove the slipcover and wash the part that covers the body of the sofa first. Wash it on cold water for 20 minutes on a normal setting. Longer if the slipcover is really messy. Step 3 - Hang a slipcover draped over them. Step 4 - Repeat above with pillow lids. Step 5 - While the slipcover is still a little wet, put it back and smooth out any wrinkles. You can probably stroke it if you feel like it, but I never do. Step 6 - Do the same with pillow covers. The whole process is quite fast, especially if the weather is warm. So now you know. PS - A few more clues. I vacuum the sofa a couple of times a year. It's pretty amazing how dusty they get. Also, I put a couple of throws on the couch if we're going to watch football and eat like we're sloppy. Download.. By now you probably know how much I love our pottery barn white sofas. I like that they me change the decor of the living room with just a couple of inexpensive throw pillows. Throw. A big fan of color, so having white sofas allows me to use so many different colors in my decor, and not be committed to just one! You can read more about this in my post Why White is the best choice when you like decorating with color. So why would I want white sofas with a house full of kids and pets? (Don't ask who makes more of a mess!) When people see our white sofas they always think we are nuts because we have 5 kids and too many pets to count! Well, we're a little crazy, but that's another story. As for the white sofas slipcovered, it's a genius if you ask me! The key is that they are slipcovered. Every visible part is washed! Another important fact is that they are high quality sofas. Now, I know that a ceramic shed may not be within everyone's budget, but I really feel that buying quality furniture for your home is a good taxation and it can actually save you money in the long run. Every piece of pottery shed furniture we have performed extremely well in our house 7 (plus pets!) used to we had to turn off the furniture every couple of years until we decided to just buy quality things that would last, even if it meant getting them a little-at least. I have two of the ceramic shed Comfort Roll Armcovered sofas in warm white denim. As I mentioned above, I realize that these are not budget sofas. It took me a while to save up for these beauties, but I feel like it's a case where you definitely get what you pay for. They are very well built and very durable. Also, they can be washed!! These are the sofas that will last a lifetime. Click any image below to find out more all the sofas I've had in the past have been from big furniture boxes stores and they'd only be for a few years before either breaking or being so dirty that you'll feel gross just sitting on them. The fact that I can wash the sofas is just amazing!! If you're in the market for a slipcovered sofa, but the pottery shed isn't quite in your budget, there are other options. I know that both IKEA and Birch Lane have more affordable options. I can't vouch for how well the mioc sofas hold up since I've never had them, but I've heard a few people mention that they love them. Cleaning SlipcoverHere are items that I use to clean my sofas: For hard stains that require a treatment spot, I use my go to the stain cleaner. It really works well. My son got a bloody nose a few nights ago and got blood all over his new pajamas. I treated the stains with this speck remover and it took the stains straight. To remove the hair of pets, my Has an excellent animal hair removal attachment. I use this fresh meadow scented bleach to make my sofas looking for new times. A word of warning: read the entire post before trying to use bleach on any slipcover. The method that I use works for me, but I can't recommend it for anyone who I only post it for informational purposes, and if you choose to use it, you will do so at your own risk. For even more slick power struggles, I wash slipcovers with Tide 10x Heavy Duty liquid laundry detergent. I also use a few sheets of this fabric softener while the lids are drying in the dryer to make them feel soft and smell clean and fresh. Making a slipcovered sofa watch PrettyThe best thing about these slipcover sofas is that you can decorate them and change the look of your entire living room by adding a few decorative throw pillows. You can always find the perfect pillow for any season. There are always tons of beautiful budget throw pillows in one of my favorite shopping spots. Don't forget to add a throw as well. Throw is a great way to add even more color to the sofas. I keep an assortment of colorful throws at hand and periodically turn them off. Now back to the sofas! I'm always asked if they're easy to clean and take care of. They're white, so yes, they get dirty. The beautiful thing is these stains and dirt can be washed out! Since I get so many guestions about sofas and how I keep them clean, I wanted to show you how I do it. Well, after this summer the sofas were in dire need of good cleaning! So I documented it all so you could see how I clean my sofas with PB slipcovered. As The Slipcovers looked after the eight months of Grime Down below, you can see Exhibit A, also known as the Moon. Luna was quite shy and skittish when we first got it. She was scared when someone came up to her, and she certainly wouldn't have dared to go up to the couch when she first came to our house. Well, it seems we may have made her feel too comfortable and at home, and lately, that's what we come to when we go down in the morning! Fast Moon! From me and she guickly goes out, but of course the damage was done, after sleeping like a princess on my white couch all night. This little gem below me was worried. This stain came from a plant that sits next to the sofa. Oddly enough, the plant is still alive, which is a miracle, since I kill plants. This is my hobby apparently... Killing plants. Hey, I have five kids, and they're still alive, so I'm doing something right. I can't win them all! Either way, the stain looked like it was going to be tough!! You can really appreciate the gloom (is that the word?) in this photo. It's about 8 months of mud right here. Fu!! Before I finished cleaning all the covers, I wanted to make sure and show you the huge difference in color between clean cover and not so clean. So read on to see how I went from dirty to sparkling clean! Washing the pottery shed Slipcovers I have to put a reservation here: The pottery shed has specific instructions about how to care for their slipcovered I don't follow them, I know I'm a rebel! As you should wash the pottery shed Slipcovers So if you want to be absolutely sure that they won't get messed up, you definitely want to follow their advice. I share with vou what I do to clean them up, it has worked for a few years and I have never had a problem. But like I said, I'm not doing exactly what the pottery shed recommends because I had to get rid of some hard stains that just aren't budging with their recommendations. You can read the recommendations of the ceramics shed below: OMG! My hubby bleached my sofa! And how it changed the way I wash my slipcovers every few months. By this point, they tend to be pretty gross. I have used the cleaning method above many times with excellent results. However, we have had some long periods of craziness around the house over the last few years and there have been times when I didn't get around for a slipcover wash and pillow covers over 6 months. Just imagine these beautiful white sofas used as a playground and pet bed for six months and you can imagine how they looked. The amount of stains and dirt build-up was excessive. After this unusually long period of neglect we, again, used the proposed method of cleaning from the ceramic shed, but some stains remained. It was too many shotguns for normal washing to come out. I was a little bummed, but put the slipcovers back because the rest of the spots were minimal and could be easily hidden, flipping the pillow or strategically placing the throw. The next time the sofas were washed, it was another long period of neglect and there were even more significant stains. This time I was dealing with a big chocolate stain, a dirty shoe print and a few other unidentified, nasty looking stains. My hubby said he was going to try soaking them for a while to loosen the stains before washing. What I didn't know was that he secretly impregnated them with bleach. Sigh!! He knew I'd be scared if I knew before I saw the finished result. How did they end up? They turned out to be amazing!!! They looked brand new, It's the only way to wash them, I do not recommend this method by any means, and if you follow this method you do so at your own risk. All I know is that this is what works best for me. Our denim sofas are in warm white. I have no idea how this will turn out for other slipcover materials. Save these couch cleaning tips for Pinterest. The denim material is very durable and well spent this cleaning process. I'm always a little hesitant when using bleach on my slipcovers, but I didn't notice anything negative with this process, not around lightning or spotted spots in the fabric. After bleaching them, the slipcovers come out a little whiter than Warm white, which I actually prefer. Of course, all I have to do is wait a couple of weeks for armed build-up from the kids and the moon, and I have warm white slipcovers again! How I wash my pottery shed Slipcovers Word Warning: As I mentioned earlier, the method that I use works for me, but I can't recommend it to anyone else. I only post it for informational purposes, and if you choose to use it, you will do so at your own risk. So, here's the process that I use, step by step: Spot cleaning and removing Slipcovers First, I thoroughly vacuum up any pet (and human) hair from the pillows and take care of all the leftovers left over from snack sessions with Goldfish, MSM and various cookies, crackers and chips. Usually I will reveal the long-lost Lego or other toys that we have been looking for for months. The fact is, I want all the lids as clean as I can get them before I remove them to be soaked (I don't want a bunch of crumbs and hair to float in the water). Second, I spot the treatment of any really hard spots with the cry of Triple Acting Spot Remover Spray. This spot I mentioned came from the factory that sits next to the sofa. Thirdly, I take off all the covers and pillow covers I then fill the tub with 16 gallons of hot water. You may ask: How can I easily figure out how much water I need in my bath, so that it is equal to 16 gallons? Here's how: Grab a 1-gallon pitcher or pitcher. Fully open the faucet of the faucet open) With a stopwatch or timer on your phone, how long it takes to fill the jug. However long that takes, multiply that number by 16 and you'll have the amount of time it takes to fill a bathtub with 16 gallons of water. In my case, it took 15 seconds to fill the 1-gallon container. So I had to leave the faucet for a total of 4 minutes to fill the tub with 16 gallons of water. I add 1 gallon of bleach to the water (water ratio 16:1 to bleach). So there aren't too many parts soaking in the bath only the lids of the pillow of the first sofa. After those soaked for hours, I remove them and then take them to the laundry room to wash and dry. I then add a sofa slipcover for the first sofa to the bath and let it soak up for hours as well. After I remove the same process for the second sofa. I'm sure I'll completely immerse everything. I let every group soak for 3 to 4 hours, moving them around periodically. After an hour or so, I switch everything up, putting the top cover on the bottom and everything becomes a good dunk. Washing and drying slipcovers and pillow covers I then remove the lids from the bathtub, ring them a bit and bring them to the laundry basket down into the laundry room to be placed in the washing machine. I don't forget to unwrap the lids and zip up so they are completely washed. I add a liquid detergent and also add more bleach to the vessel to the washer filling it with the MAX line. I then set the water temperature of the washer in HOT. Yes, you're reading it right. Yikes! Will the lids be reduced? Find out below. After being out of the washer, I put the lids to dry using a sensor on my LG dryer. The sensor always turns off the dryer until it dries completely. I'm not sure if this is an issue with my dryer, but it works out perfectly because I need the covers to be slightly wet putting them back on the sofas. I explain why below. Placing Slipcovers Back on the sofas, as I mentioned above, the lids are a bit damp when I take them out of the dryer. Placing the lids back on the couch when they are slightly wet will prevent them from wrinkles so much. So they were shrinking? I'm always afraid that slipcovers may end up shrinking in hot water, but denim always perfect. And a vuila!!! Beautiful Pure White Slipcover Couches As usual, the sofas came out looking beautiful. No more dirt and that ugly stains from the factory are gone. Now it's time for the fun part! Start decorating! So you have! That's how I clean the sofas! I think there's a man from a ceramic shed reading my blog and crying because I soak up my lids in bleach and then on top that I have the courage to wash them in hot water! I have had sofas for years, if I didn't wash them like this, then they would be ruined because of all the stains on them. So I was willing to take a chance because I really couldn't lose! Who knows, they may start to fall in a few years because of bleach, but like I said, they already looked pretty nasty! Would I wash them like this if they were brand new? Probably not. I would probably wait until they reached the point of doing or dying. Either way, my apologies to the Pottery Shed for rebelling against their cleaning instructions!
