

Welcoming the Year of the Ox



With one month of 2021 over, we have another chance at a new start in February as we usher in the lunar new year on the 12th. The reaction from people in Singapore is that this may not be a bad thing. The vaccine is still not available to the majority, and new, deadly strains of more infectious viruses are popping up all over the place.

At this time of writing, there are no community infections in Singapore, and no critical cases in hospitals. The total death toll remains at 28, all of whom were older victims.

Here are some ways that we can stay safe as we welcome the year of the ox.

- 1. Stay protected. When you do your spring cleaning this year, put in an extra effort to sanitize and disinfect thoroughly. Check the corners and hidden areas behind cupboards and under the bed. Some may even want to engage a professional cleaner for this once-a-year routine.

- 5. Enjoy family. Friends come and go, but familes are forever. With the restriction on 8 visitors, chances are that your guests are your extended family. Prepare ang pows for each one with a traditional package of pork jerky which will be much appreciated.
- 6. Factor in the Lord as you take each and every step in the new year, beginning with the first day. Have you been neglectful in the past year? Plan to do better!
- 7. Finally, and most important, what are you going to do differently in 2021? Recount the past year, and as you do, do what the MRT constantly reminds us, "mind the gaps". Sometimes it is not the big things that floored us, but the little ommisions that slipped through.

Rebuilding the Church



At the end of last month, I sent a mass text via WhatsApp to HoF members and supporters with a 5-question survey on how the Covid-19 restrictions to not assemble have affected us. This survey is reproduced on right column. It is clear that everyone missed the joy of worship and the warmth of fellowship. A few mentioned that they were not disciplined and have neglected their faith and weekly giving.

We are very concerned by the response and are making immediate arrangements to address these needs.

While it is difficult to feel the pulse of the church during this period of Covid-19 restrictions, even as we try to keep in touch, we believe that our members have been badly affected.

As a result, we have followed up the survey with a text to members individually, seeking your perferences to assembling together again. A letter was also be sent to every member by our postal service.

When the responses come in, we will know how to further meet the needs of our members. We will need the support of faithful members as we encourage those who have not been doing well.

There is more that we need to do, especially with children Bible classes that have been halted and Care teams not meeting.

Let us improve, one step at a time. In the words of Nehemiah 2:20, *The God of heaven, He will prosper us; therefore we His servants will arise and build.*






3. Focus on Others


We take the weekly live stream worship very seriously and put in our best effort. We look forward to your participation and support.

The Anatomy of Passion 3. Feet Romans 10:15 As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the Gospel of peace, Who bring glad tidings of good things!" Where do your feet bring you to outside work? Psalms 122:1 I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the LORD. Isaiah 6:8 I heard the Lord's voice, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am. Send me!" Mark 16:15 He said to them, "Go into all the world, and preach the Gospel to the whole creation.











Most of us have certain preconceived ideas about what the Bible teaches on the subject of giving. You may be surprised by these 7 things that the Bible says about giving.

1. It is not compulsary for anyone to give to God. The Bible says in 2 Corinthians 9:7 Let each man give according as he has determined in his heart; not grudgingly, or under compulsion; for God loves a cheerful giver (World English Bible).

You should never feel forced to give to God because God will only accept a gift that is offered through freewill, cheerfully.

2. No one should tell us how much to give.

2 Corinthians 9:7 Let each man give according as he has determined in his heart; not grudgingly, or under compulsion; for God loves a cheerful giver (World English Bible).

3. God wants you to give only from what you have.

2 Corinthians 8:12 For if the readiness is there, it is acceptable according to what you have, not according to what you don't have (World English Bible).

God does not expect you to borrow to give to Him or to 'give by faith'. If you have the readiness or willingness to give, just give what you can. I like the way the Common English Bible (2011) translates 2 Corinthians 8:12 - *A gift is appreciated because of what a person can afford, not because of what that person can't afford, if it's apparent that it's done willingly.*

4. You should give because you want to.

There should not be a reason or a need to cause you to give. Again, we refer to 2 Corinthians 9:7 Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver (KJV).

For the Christian, we give on a weekly basis as the Lord enables us. There is no need to justify our giving in order to find a reason to give or stop giving.

5. God is not as much interested in how much we give, but at how much we have left over.

Luke 21:1-4 He looked up, and saw the rich people who were putting their gifts into the treasury. He saw a certain poor widow casting in two small brass coins. He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow put in more than all of them, for all these put in gifts for God from their abundance, but she, out of her poverty, put in all that she had to live on."

6. We should grow in our giving.

2 Corinthians 8:7 - But since you excel in everything--in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you --see that you also excel in this grace of giving (NIV).

7. God will enable us to keep giving.

2 Corinthians 9:10 Now may he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food, supply and multiply your seed for sowing, and increase the fruits of your righteousness (WEB).

What Does The Bible Say About Regular Church Attendance?

Hebrews 10:25 - Not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Matthew 18:20 - For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them.

Colossians 3:16 - Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

Acts 2:42- And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

Hebrews 10:24-25 - And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Matthew 6:33 - But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.
