African Folklore Embroidery By Sharon Camping

Sharon Camping is a certified African Folklore Embroidery Educator. African Folklore Embroidery was founded by Leora Raikin, originally from South Africa, to share knowledge about South Africa and its arts, wildlife and culture. Sharon will have a fun and entertaining presentation for us.

Kits of various sizes and prizes will be available and feature many lovely African folk art designs of wildlife, Ndebele tribeswomen and village life. Kits feature nicely edged fabric (less likely to unravel), hand-dyed rayon threads and unique designs. All kits and threads are crafted by African village women and provide a source of income for them and their families.

Sharon will also be teaching a workshop titled "African Folklore Embroidery" on Saturday 3, October. Please see Workshops at the meeting for more details.

**Porcupine
Meatballs**

Hello fellow Acacia Quilt Guild Members. I'm sending along this delicious and delightful recipe that has stood the test of time. If you have never tried Porcupine Meatballs before I'm sure you and your family will enjoy them.


- 1 pound ground beef (I use 1/2 gr beef and 1/2 gr turkey for good flavor and lower fat and lower cholesterol)
- 1/4 cup uncooked long-grain rice
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 1 Tablespoon snipped parsley
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion (I added 1/4 cup each finely chopped celery and bell pepper. More veggies means I get to eat more food and have a fuller tummy for fewer calories)
- 1/2 tsp. salt (I added 1/2 tsp. each basil and Mrs. Dash)
- Dash pepper
- 1 10 3/4 oz can condensed tomato soup
-
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Combine meat, rice, egg, parsley, onion (celery-bell pepper), spices, and 1/4 cup tomato soup. Mix thoroughly; shape in about 20 (or 15 or 16 or) small balls. Cook in skillet until browned on all sides, drain.

Mix remaining soup, water, and Worcestershire sauce; pour over meatballs. Bring to a boil; reduce heat; cover and simmer for about 40 minutes, stirring often. Serve, Eat, and Enjoy!




Tea and Quilt Auction
