OUR OWN PATTERN PARTY AND TRUNK SHOW

Acacia Quilt Guild has special plans for July, so be sure to be there for a special night. Our July 1 meeting will feature your opportunity to view and purchase over 500 patterns from Quiltwoman.com. Patterns will be available at the August meeting, unless you need them sooner.

First, we will have a trunk show featuring quilts, bags and other items made with Quiltwoman patterns.

These items will have patterns available that evening. Then, everyone will have the opportunity to look through 8 binders of patterns quilts, table runners, holiday items, clothing, bags, totes, novelties, boutique items and much more! You can choose which patterns to purchase at a discount. These patterns retail from \$9 to \$12, but you will pay only \$7.50 per pattern! AND, our guild will receive a portion of what is sold to help with our budget for this new fiscal year.

These patterns are identified as beginner, intermediate, or advanced. The yardage is given purchase, so you know how much fabric you will need. Many of the quilt patterns offer yardage requirements for several sizes of quilts, from baby to king.

We will have some special door prizes for all who purchase one or more patterns, so come and bring a friend too.

We also need to give a count of the Christmas quilts by July 9. If you aren't quite done before then, let Phyllis Campbell know you will be bringing one to our August meeting.

Quilt Daze VIII will be held at the Yorba Linda Community Center on Saturday and Sunday, August 21 and 22 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. It is located at 4501 Casa Loma at the corner of Imperial Hwy. and Casa Loma. Admission is \$7.00, and parking is free. There will be opportunity quilts, baskets, refreshments and lunch available.

This show is a fund-raiser for the Yorba Linda Historical Society and the Yorba Linda Women's Club. Many of the Orange County guilds will have their quilts on display. It is a great local show with lots to see without driving far or having to pay to park.

We will be asking for volunteers to white glove at our display on both days. The Opportunity Quilt committee will also be looking for volunteers to sell tickets too. This is a great opportunity to invite people to visit our guild, so please sign up for a shift.

Block of the Month June 2010

Patriotic Star - Red, White and Blue - 16 Patch - Yield 12 1/2" Block

Cutting....

- 1. cut 8 (ea) white ½ square triangles from 4 (ea) 4" squares
- 2. cut 6 (ea) blue 3½" squares
- 3. cut 2 (ea) red 3½" squares
- 4. cut 8 (ea) red ½ square triangles from 4 (ea) 4" squares

Assembly....

Make 8 (ea) squares using 1 each white ½ square triangle and 1 each red ½ square triangle. Press & square up to 3 ½"

Row 1 four squares: 1 - blue sq

- 1 1/2 triangle sq with red on the upper right
- 1 1/2 triangle sq with red on the upper left
- 1 blue sq

Row 2 four squares: 1 - 1/2 sq triangle with red on the lower left

- 1 blue sq
- 1 red sq
- 1 1/2 sq triangle with red on the lower right

Row 3 four squares: 1 - 1/2 sq triangle with red on the upper left

- 1 red sq
- 1 blue sq
- 1 1/2 sq triangle with red on the upper right

Row 4 four squares: 1- blue sq

- 1- 1/2 sq triangle with red on the lower right
- 1 1/2 sq triangle with red on the lower left
- 1 blue sq

I nested the last three seams and pressed them open.

Legend: R=red W=white

RECIPES

Popcorn Frito Mix

- 2 bags of microwave popcorn -not butter/ light butter
- 1 bag of regular size Fritos
- 1 bag of Candy Kwik (vanilla) (could also use white chocolate)

Pop 2 bags of popcorn. Divide the popcorn and Fritos into 2 bowls and mix. Break the Candy Kwik in half. Follow the microwave directions for melting half the Candy Kwik. Pour the Fritos and popcorn mixture onto wax paper. Pour the Candy Kwik over the dry mixture. It takes one hour to harden. Prepare the other half of the mixture.
