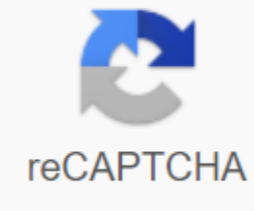

Make sure that your hazardous waste transport company adequately disposes of your hazardous waste? Federal regulations, through the Resources and Recovery Act 1976 (RCRA), require hazardous waste generators to maintain responsibility for their cradle-to-grave waste. This means that you, as a waste generator, have a full responsibility to comply with the RCRA regulations on hazardous waste you generate - from its initial generation, through transport to final disposal. Certificate of destruction One of the most important components of the removal of hazardous waste is the certificate of destruction. This certificate is only one of the records required for the dispatch of hazardous waste. According to the Ministry of Toxic Substances (DTSC), a single manifesto for hazardous waste appears, which is transported outside the place of delivery. Why are documents so important to your company? For example, the certificate of destruction provides generators with a method of tracking their cargo from hazardous waste. This ensures that the waste has been properly disposed of and information on where the disposal took place is offered. When you get one, here are 10 items that each certificate must include and should automatically be part of the details of the destruction template: What should be included in a certificate of destruction? 1. Description of the resulting waste The accuracy of this section is important because it describes exactly what type of hazardous waste is transported for disposal. 7. A legal opinion on the part of the waste transporter is necessary in order to accordance with the Regulations. An example of the legal language used in this statement is: (XYZ Hazardous Waste Transporter) certifies that the transport, storage, processing and certificate of disposal methods agreed by (XYZ Transporter) for the above materials comply with all federal and state regulations, DOT provisions and all applicable state and federal environmental protection agencies (EPA) and Department of Toxic of the Substance (DTSC) laws. 8. Correctness Declaration Unlike the legal declaration, corrective declarations are simple in structure, stating that the information in the certificate of destruction is accurate. An example of a declaration of accuracy may be: (XYZ hazardous waste transporter) certifies that the information contained in or accompanying this document is correct, accurate and complete. 9. Signature The document must be signed and certified by an authorized representative of the transport company. 10. Certification date The certificate must also include the date on which it was issued by the hazardous waste transporter. An example of a certificate of destruction An important remark that ensures that all federal and state regulations are met must be the highest priority in managing your hazardous waste streams. Even if you need additional security precautions for a certified disposal product, including a certificate of destruction should be the minimum you insist on from the carrier. Why... While destruction certificates are not required by a Regulation, they shall provide generators with a method for tracking their cargo from hazardous waste. Vehicles intended for recycling must first acquire a certificate of destruction issued by the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) in a registered authorised treatment facility (ATF). This is a legal requirement for all cars before recycling. However, this does not mean that all vehicles that the ATF collects are for recycling. Where an insurance company pays a claim for a car, it owns the vehicle from the person and has the right to revise the definition of the vehicle as a certificate of destruction. This means that someone there is already driving in a vehicle that is potentially dangerous. If caught on the road for violation, the car will appear registered under the name of the original owner. A much worse scenario is if the car was deliberately used for illegal actions, the previous owner will be the one who suffers the consequences. Unfortunately, even if a person is the victim of an unscrupulous car breaker, the DVLA will not accept the alibi of pointing to another person or establishment. Even after the sale of the vehicle for scrapping or destruction, the DVLA will consider it the ultimate responsibility of the owner to make sure that he receives the certificate of destruction.
