But when I pass the object to json.loads() I get None. I am confused as to why. I know that it has something to do with this dict_util.py in object d = dict(self._json_) should I be using json.loads(self._json_) to get the object data? JSONPacket.parse expects it's argument to be the response body, not the HTTP Headers or Content-type header. In python2.7 and jsonlint.com, "key": "value" and { key : 'value' } are equivalent. (the latter is the most common). But when I pass the object to json.loads() I get None. Because the object you are sending is a JSONPacket object, not a dictionary.
