Seeing the Harvest Right Now
John 4:34-38

John 4:35-38

35 Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest.

36 Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together.

37 For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.'

38 I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor.



1. Recognising the ready field

- **Do you not say, ‘There are yet four months, then comes the harvest’? (v35a)**
 - Starting from seeds → total growing → producing harvest → four months
- **Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. (v35b)**
 - Failed to recognise readiness
 - Few labourers (Matthew 9:37–38)
 - Others sit back and just keep watching things (Ecclesiastes 11:4)
 - Get involved!

2. Celebrating the joy of reaping



Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. (v36)

- What are the wages? Rejoicing with heaven for every soul that is saved seeing them coming to Christ and receiving eternal life
- Lost sheep, coin, son found - celebration with his friends and neighbors
- "He who goes out weeping, carrying seed for sowing, will certainly come again with joy, carrying his sheaves." (Psalm 126:6)
- "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, And he who wins souls is wise." (Proverbs 11:30)

3. Sowing in many ways



For here the saying holds true, ‘One sows and another reaps.’ (v37)

- Who is the sower? The preacher, those who who share the gospel
- Verbally or nonverbally, in small ways (1 Cor 3:5-9)
- Many ways we can be involved!

4. Building on the labour of others

- **I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. (v38)**
 - The ground work is always laid by someone else
 - For example, before Philip proclaimed Christ in Samaria and many were baptised (Acts 8:12)
 - Each generation builds on the work that has come before us - we reap where we have not sown



•Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor. (v38)

- Who did the hard labour that you and I have entered into?

Exhortation

- Nine years ago, a group of you planted seeds in this faith community. Today, many have entered into their labour.
- Looking ahead, let's lift our eyes to the next harvest...
- And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. (Galatians 6:9)
