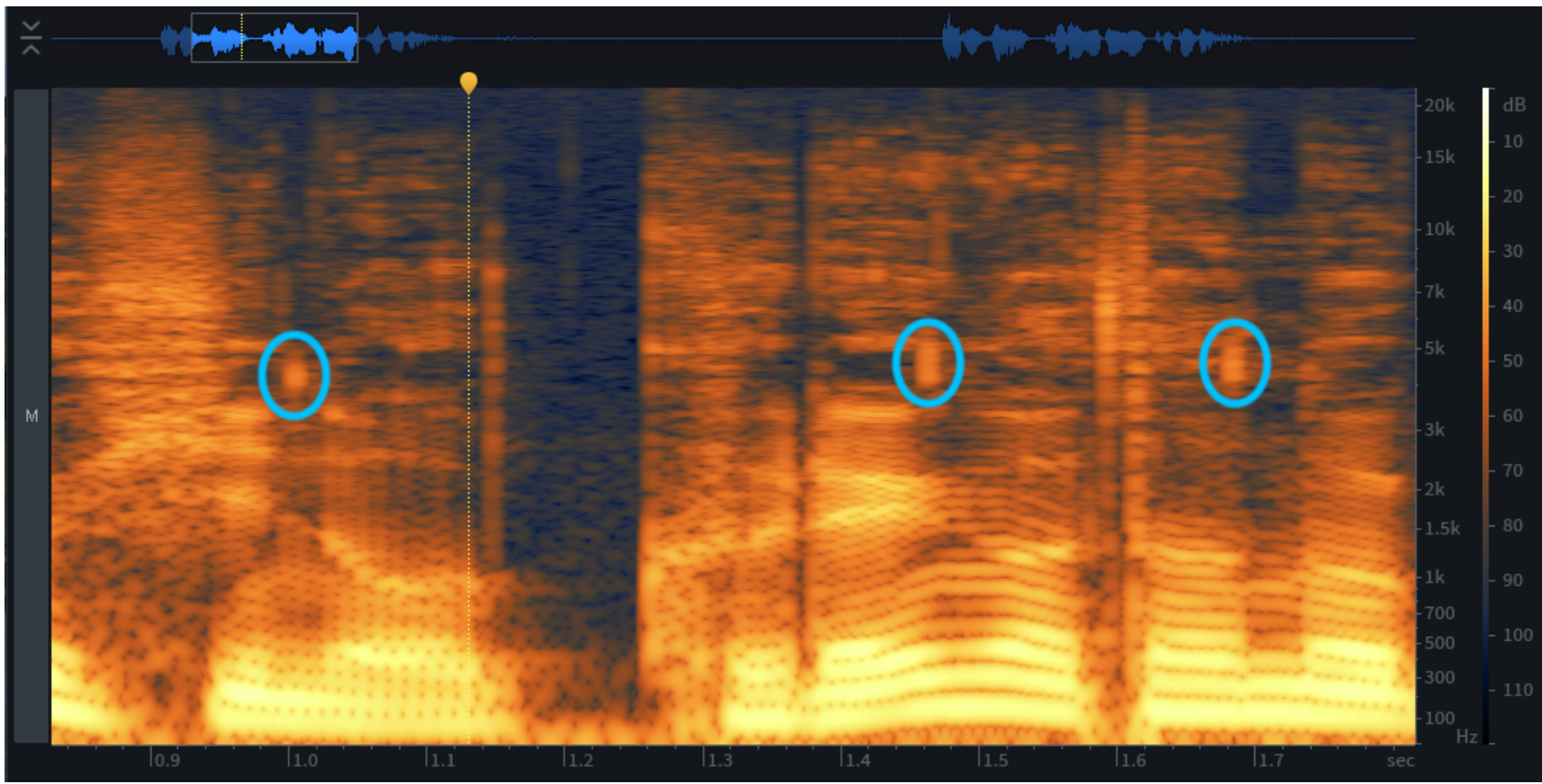


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, but that will give you the right to do whatever you want with the software, except restrict its use to one computer or to a limited network. 4. If you are the copyright holder of a non-software work, the situation may be simpler. If you have copyright to a non-software work, you're free to do what you want with it, just not to restrict its use, and to enforce your copyright. If you can't be sure, then it's a legal gray area. In the United States, I think the copyright law regarding the use of copyrighted music with the broadcast of the copyrighted music would likely give you the rights you need to make use of that music in your advertisements. In the United States, the legal limit for the use of copyright music in a television or radio program seems to be 4 minutes per hour, although a court might rule that the use of a recording from a program which lasts 9 minutes is permissible, and the use of a recording which lasts 10 minutes is not. If your program lasts for more than 4 minutes, you may have problems with this (and, at the very least, it may be illegal). In the past, when I had a similar issue, I would create a blanket license for everything, and simply give a copy of the license to the company who would be broadcasting the program and to the company who had the musical score, and ask them to use the music in their show, and ask them to send me the audio. The company doing the live broadcast of the program could use the music in any way they wanted. The company who owns the musical score could use the music in any way they wanted to, but I think the 4-minute rule may apply (and I could be wrong about this). The legal part of it is complicated, so I would consult an attorney to make sure you are doing everything correctly. Q: TDD - How to get data from the database when unit test fails I have some tables on the database, and I don't want that my tests retrieve data from the database. I would like to get the data on the test database, with a given set of parameters. Does anyone know how to accomplish this?
