Hello, 11 years ago I had my mole removed from my back. I didn't have my lymph nodes removed. I was told to check my lungs annually, but once I was the last 5 years I was considered cured. It scared me terribly because I had little twins and I was a single mother. Over the years, my X-rays of lungs and mammos were all clear and I felt kind of stupid to use my insurance money to check for cancer year after year. One doctor said: You are trying to find something that does not exist. I said no, I was trying to check something that might exist. Drugs. Anyway, two years ago the ultimatum found nodules in countless in my thyroid gland. Seven of them grew, albeit very slowly. My endocrinologist feels they are filled with fluid, without consequences, and has refused to biopsy them. Last month I had knee surgery with shortness of breath. The surgeon ordered the chest CT to check for clots (no) and the CT showed 4 light nodules. All four are small, one is calcified. Size from 2.3 mm to 4.8 mm I also have a small stain on the right kidney, too small to biopsy. I have some big cysts on my ovaries, gyno wants to watch them. What, blow up? My age is 51 and I am generally healthy. I'm afraid I'm in the early stages of the lung fore. I have an appt this week with primary MD to get a referral to the oncologist. I feel as if I quit going to specialists... endocrinologist, nephrologist, gino, pulmonary I can get someone to look at the whole picture, not just one organ with a mild to small problem. I have lost 25 pounds in the last 6 months without effort, diet changes or explanations. I was thrilled with the loss of WT, but now it concerns me as a sign of cancer. My question is, what size were your nodules of the lungs before the doctor considered them of interest? I see a lot with knots a few centimeters, but should I wait until they grow up before anyone considering whether my melanoma is back? I think I would like a pet scan, but is there anything else that could be more useful? My husband is scared to death, but his reaction is to spin it all into a happy chat. I have no one to talk to, who will be honest and discuss it openly. My good friend is battling lung cancer and it was horrible to watch. Thanks for your support anyway. Regard...
