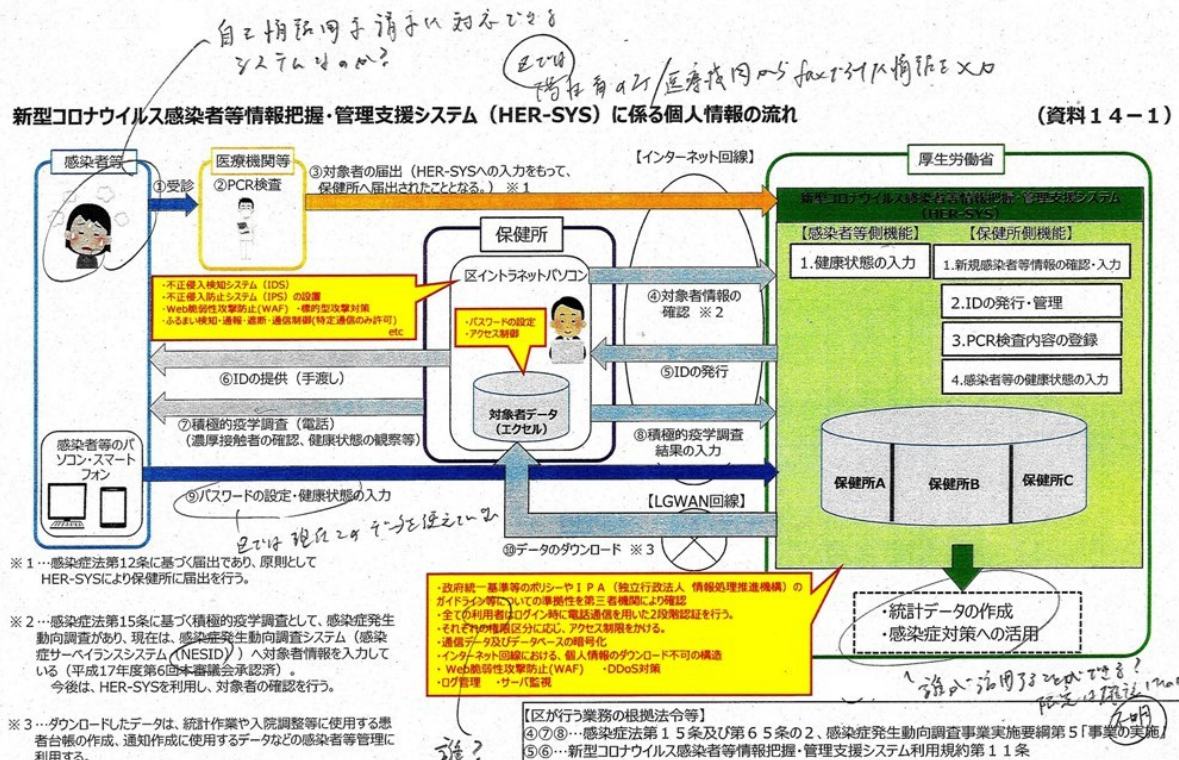

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= "[% Color ]" And then just do something like this in your vimrc, if you don't want to use gvim to copy that in your gvimrc: let g:airline\_theme\_default\_colors = { 'background' : '[% bgcolor ]' } let g:airline\_theme\_colors = { 'None' : '[% bgcolor ]', 'Comment' : '[% bgcommentcolor ]' } If you want to customize the colors in the panel, you have to add the colors you want to the map, like: let g:airline\_theme\_colors = { 'Comment' : '[% bgcommentcolor ]' } let g:airline\_graphical\_colors = { 'LineNr' : '[% line\_nocolor ]', 'Line' : '[% l:NONE:bg ]', 'Divider' : '[% l:NONE:divider ]', 'Selected' : '[% b:FOLDER:sel ]', 'Folder' : '[% b:FOLDER:sel ]', 'CurrentFile' : '[% b:FILE:txt ]' } let g:airline\_graphical\_rows = { 'LineNr' : '[% line\_nocolor ]', 'File' : '[% b:FILE:txt ]', 'Selected' : '[% b:FOLDER:sel ]', 'Line' : '[% l:NONE:bg ]', 'Divider' : '[% l:NONE:divider ]', 'Folder' : '[% b:FOLDER:sel ]' } let g:airline\_graphical\_ruler = { 'none' : '' } This will give you these colors: Another way to do this in vim is to use the command colorscheme, and it will create a directory with the color names that vim uses. colorscheme airline will create this: ~/.vim/colors/airline.vim After 520fdb1ae7

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
