Short Description of Event;

Mutually Entangled brings together eight painters from the TURPS ALUMNI family, exploring interconnections between the human and non-human world, where consciousness, matter and environment are mutually entangled (in paint).

Full Description:

The title: Mutually Entangled refers to a quantum physics phenomenon, where two or more particles become linked, sharing a single unified quantum state, creating co-dependence and interconnectivity.

With a focus on the ineffable: tracks, residues and traces, making something intangible and unseen visible - such as cosmic rays, micro and macro organisms, above and below ground, the passage of time and a memory of place. The exhibition presents and attempts to order these encounters, moving towards more visceral and primal responses, from the ethereal and bodiless to the corporeal and primal, embodied encounters with the natural world occupy these painters. Mutually Entangled positions painting as a site of exchange, where material, body and land are understood as porous, osmotic, responsive and profoundly connected.

A shared language of painting and art history also provides another form of entanglement - making painting is very much a conversation in paint with artists from the past and present alike.
