[2] Previously, he was senior editor for the National Journal and editor-in-chief of The Weekly Standard. He was a staunch supporter of the war in Iraq and an influential figure in promoting the false claim that Saddam Hussein's regime and Al Qaeda had an operational relationship. [5] Early life Stephen F. Hayes was born in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin. He graduated from DePauw University,[6] where he was a member of the Sigma Chi fraternity. He then studied journalism at Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism. Hayes career with Paul Ryan in 2018 As a career political journalist, his work has appeared in the New York Post, the Washington Times, Salon.com, National Review and Reason. He has been a commentator on CNN, The McLaughlin Group, Fox News Channel, MSNBC, CNBC and C-SPAN. He became editor-in-chief of The Weekly Standard in 2016. On December 14, 2018, Clarity Media Group announced that it would cease publication of the magazine after 23 years. The closure of The Weekly Standard was whether Clarity Media's other magazine, the Washington Examiner, could absorb Standard subscribers. [8] In 2019, Hayes, along with Jonah Goldberg and Toby Stock, formed the conservative media company The Dispatch. [10] Supporter of the Iraq War Before the proposed invasion of Iraq in 2003, Stephen Hayes addressed BBC News, pleading for an American intervention: I think the liberation of Iraq will send a strong message to Iran, North Korea, other hostile regimes not only because it will show that we will - the UNITED States will not tolerate bullies , especially the bullies with weapons of mass destruction, but it will also I think we hope to show what a free free people liberated, what a free iraqi people liberated can do for themselves and it will be - again this will be a fabulous model, not only for the Middle East, but for places around the world that have not had such freedoms in the past or have not realized them. [11] False Allegations of Collaboration between Saddam Hussein and Al Qaeda In 2004, Gideon Rose, editor-in-chief of Foreign Affairs, described Hayes as the most tireless supporter of the Iraq-Al Qaeda link outside the administration [George W. Bush]. In 2008, Spencer Ackerman described Hayes as one of the most effective amplifiers of the Bush administration's claims over the Iraq war about a link [13] Investigations into the link between Hussein and Al Qaeda concluded that there was no connection. [13] In 2004, the September 11 Commission concluded that there was no operational collaborative relationship. [13] His 2004 book, The How Al Qaeda's collaboration with Saddam Hussein endangered America claimed to prove an operational relationship between Saddam Hussein's Iraq and al-Qaeda. Its main source was a memo leaked by Under-Secretary of Defense for Policy Douglas J. Feith to the U.S. Congress on October 27, 2003; Deputy Secretary of Defense Paul Wolfowitz had asked Feith to link Hussein to Al Qaeda. [15] Hayes covered the contents of this note in a 2003 Weekly Standard article, where he concluded, There can no longer be a serious argument as to whether Saddam Hussein's Iraq worked with Osama bin Laden and al-Qaeda to plot against the Americans. [17] Other intelligence officials disputed the accuracy of the contents in Feith's memo, including W. Patrick Lang, former head of the Middle East section of the IAD, and described the Weekly Standard article as a list of a mass of unconfirmed reports, many of which themselves indicate that the two groups continued to attempt to establish some kind of relationship. If they had such a productive relationship, why did they have to keep trying? [17] Evaluations by the Pentagon and the CIA disavowed the contents of Feith's note. [16] Hayes' personal life resides in Davidsonville, Maryland with his wife and four children. In September 2014, Hayes' name was added to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's terrorist surveillance list after a more thorough review of several flights. He has since been cleared and is not currently on the terrorist watch list. America's enemies seemed to be united from all sides, and for several agonizing months, we lived in fear that the perpetrators would plot another action or, worse, that our most dangerous enemies -- al-Qaeda and Saddam Hussein's murderous regime in Iraq -- would unite against us. The Bush administration and CIA Director George Tenet warned against complacency and pointed to growing indications that al Qaeda and Iraq were in league. But their case has been undermined by anonymous intelligence officials, skeptical politicians, and a compliant media. So America relaxed. A comforting consensus was established: Osama bin Laden was a passionate fundamentalist, Saddam a secular autocrat. The two would never work together. ABC News reported that there was no connection between them, and the New York Times said so too, and very soon just about everyone agreed. Pretty much everyone was wrong. In The Connection, Stephen Hayes relies on debriefings from CIA, top-secret memos from our national intelligence agencies, and interviews with Iraqi military leaders and Washington insiders to demonstrate that Saddam and bin Laden not only could work together, they did - a curious relationship that goes back more than a decade may include collaboration on terrorist acts, chemical weapons training and hosting some of the world's most wanted radicals.
