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The acronyms are similar to abbreviations, in that they are an abbreviated way of expressing an idea. Acronyms are usually formed using the first letter of each word in a phrase to form a new word. For example, the phrase you only live once is often shortened to YOLO. Acronyms are usually written with a capital letter and pronounced as a new word. The list of common acronyms Acronym is a general term that can also include initialisms. Alphabet Agency During the Great Depression, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt created a number of institutions to stimulate job growth in the United States. Known as alphabet agencies, these are some of the most famous abbreviations today. AAA - Agricultural Adjustment Act. This law was created in 1933 to compensate farmers for not planting crops as a way to increase demand for certain agricultural products and raise prices. By 1936, the Supreme Court had ruled that the act should be annulled. CCC - Civil Conservation Corps. Single men between the ages of 18 and 25 have been selected to form this corps, which will work to preserve wildlife and national reserves, in addition to planting trees and combating erosion. CWA - Civil Works Administration. Four million people have been employed by CWA to work in repair and construction jobs such as building repairs, road construction, and other infrastructure work.
