

# Robert Sauerwein Medal

## Guide for nominees

June 2020

### Profile of the nominees:

- Be early career researcher (PhD students or within 3 years after PhD graduation).
- Have made major contributions to our understanding of tropical infectious diseases. This contribution may be in the field of basic and/or applied research.
- Be affiliated with a university or research institute in the Netherlands (but not necessarily have the Dutch nationality).

### Submission process:

- Submit a cover letter.
- Submit a complete CV.
- Provide at least 1 (maximum 2) supporting letter(s) of recommendation.
- Deadline: 1 October 2020.

### Cover letter:

- Your cover letter can be in Dutch or English; should be a maximum of 1 page and should be provided in pdf format.
- The cover letter should briefly explain why you feel you have made a major contribution to the field of tropical infectious diseases.
- What other activities you undertook and what results were garnered.
- It should state how your contribution relates to overall global health.
- Should summarise your future ambitions and ultimate goals.

### CV:

- Your CV may be provided in Dutch or English, with a maximum of 2 pages and provided in pdf format.
- Please include the following heading in the CV:
  - **Summary of research activities.** In this section you may list a resume of research activities since the start of your academic career. A strong resume includes information of your role in the listed activities.
  - **Education.** In this section you are asked to provide details on your education and the diploma's you acquired, including the year these were awarded. Include also the date of your doctoral thesis defense, the title of the thesis, and full names of supervisors.
  - **Work experience.** Here you may list your current position and previous and current academic and non-academic experience where you see it as relevant for the nomination.
  - **Grants, fellowships and awards.** If applicable, you may list any grants/fellowships or awards you received.

- **Membership of academic and societal organizations.** If applicable, you may list any membership or involvement in academic and societal organizations.
- **Presentations.** If you have presented work at (international) conferences or in outreach activities, you may provide an overview here.
- **Most relevant publications.** You may list up to 3 publications, together with reasoning why you selected these publications as your most relevant publications. No additional publications or a full list of publications should be provided. Citation indices will not be considered as part of the selection process.

**Supporting letter of recommendation:**

A maximum of 2 supporting letters can be provided with your nomination. These can be written in Dutch or English and have a free format. However, they should be on institutional letterhead, be signed by the nominator and provided in pdf format. Letters should include information on how long the nominator has known the nominee (and in what function) and support the claim that the nominee has made an outstanding contribution to research into tropical infectious diseases.
