

The egalitarian perspective holds that men and women are created equal in the image of God and, therefore, should have equal roles and responsibilities in the church, home, and society.

Key Scriptural Passages 📖

Egalitarians base their views on a number of Bible verses that they interpret as supporting gender equality and mutual submission in all spheres of life.

- **Genesis 1:26-27:** This is a foundational passage for egalitarians, who emphasize that God created both male and female in his image, giving them equal dignity and responsibility to exercise dominion over creation.
 - **Galatians 3:28:** "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." This verse is a cornerstone of egalitarian theology. It is interpreted as a declaration that in Christ, the social and hierarchical distinctions of the world—including those based on gender—are transcended.
 - **Joel 2:28-29 (cited in Acts 2:17-18):** "And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy... Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days." Egalitarians point to this fulfillment on the Day of Pentecost as evidence that the Holy Spirit empowers both men and women for ministry and leadership roles, including prophesying and teaching.
 - **Romans 16:1-7:** This chapter mentions numerous women in leadership positions in the early church. Paul refers to **Phoebe** as a deacon (diakonos), **Priscilla** as a fellow worker (synergos) with Paul who taught Apollos, and **Junia** as a prominent apostle. These examples are used to show that women held positions of authority and were integral to the mission of the early church.
