Mortal Kombat is another Warner Bros fighter with about the same mechanics. Neither of these games is great, but they are both worthy of time killers. King Fighters ALLSTARPrice: Free to play To King Fighters ALLSTAR is one of the new fighting games on the list relatively speaking. The action takes place in the KoF universe and has a bunch of characters from different games. It's a bit of a button masher, but it has more control options than something like Mortal Kombat X or Injustice 2. The game also has an online PvP, a co-op game and a campaign option. People seem to really like this aside from the lag issues when playing PvP matches. Other than that, it's a solid free fighter play. Punch Boxing 3DPPrice: Free to playPunch Boxing 3D is the first of several boxing games on this list. As with most boxing games, the game is a little slower than the combo of the fighters, and you rely more on the block and kick moves rather than movement. The graphics are in order, and the controls seem to be functioning as intended. It's a bit unfortunate that your controls are essentially limited to block and kick, but that's how it goes sometimes. The audio is also pretty bad. You can also align your character by battling in the gym and there are a number of accessories that you can unlock. Real Boxing 2Price: Free to PlayReal Boxing 2 (previously boxing 2 Rocky) is a continuation of the sequel One of the best fighting games out there. You get to play both (and against) a popular fictional character as you fight. There is also a lot of things to do. You can challenge other fighters, participate in mini-games, fight with bosses and even create your own character. He has a selection of bonuses and gears and that can turn back into the battle for better or worse. The controls are pretty decent as graphics. There is also social mechanics in the form of leaders and gifts. Real Steel seriesPrice: Free to playReal Steel is a series of robotic combat games from Reliance Games. Unlike most, these titles have an arcade-style wrestling management. This means that you have to move and hit on your own. There are four games in the robot fighting series, each with its own set of mechanics, appearance, and stuff to do. The most popular, Real Steel World Robot Boxing, includes customization, multiplayer, and several other game modes. The last game in the series World Robot Boxing 2 and has quite worthy reviews. They are at the higher end of the range of combat games. PrizefightersPrice: Free to playPrizefighters is another of the new fighting games. This retro style of boxing is similar to those from the SNES era (1990s). It has simple controls, player and ring settings, progression systems, social features, and more. Developers also promise online multiplayer at some point. This should raise an already above-average experience. It's good for fans of retro combat games. In-app shopping is not as bad as competitors. Shadow Fight 3Price: Free playShadow Fight 3 is the latest game in the popular combat franchise. It picks up where his predecessors have stopped with some differences. For example, the series shed its silhouette graphics in favor of fully animated character models. Most of the game remains the same. Mechanics also got a bit of renovation in favor of something a little more modern. This is unfortunate because the mechanics in previous games were quite unique and fun. Either way, you can't go wrong with any of the Shadow Fight games. Just keep in mind that they are free to play and make for better killer time than deep, attractive fighting games. SkullgirlsPrice: Free to play Skullgirls a little diamond in the rough. It's not mentioned in the same conversations as Street Fighter or KoF, but people seem like this. The game brands itself as a 2D combat RPG with mechanics from both genres. You collect different characters, level them up and then use them to beat other people. The game is a little heavier on RPG elements than it is fighter elements, but there are enough controls out there to scratch that itch. Online PvP has some problems, including the occasional lopsided but otherwise it seems a nice little little Fighter. SNK Corporation Combat GamesPrice: Free /Up \$2.99 Each corporation is probably the best game developer right now. They have a decent collection of retro combat games. Some of these include several King Fighters titles, Samurai Showdown Games, Garu: Mark Wolves, and The Fatal Fury Special. Most of these games ports from previous consoles or arcade boxes. However, SNK did a good job with them. They all rock solid retro fighters with one purchase price and no in-app purchases. They didn't get an update at the time. The Street Fighter IV Champion EditionPrice: Free/\$4.99Street Fighter IV Champion Edition is one of the great releases of the 2018 Combat Games. It's not without its problems, though. The full game has a decent selection of characters and actual combat mechanics. It also includes a few somewhat broken but functional features such as Bluetooth controller support and online PvP. We'll be honest, this one still needs some work. However, Capcom seems to be up to call with a band of updates in the first few weeks of release. Most of the problems were fixed in the first year, and the Google Play rating seems to be turning away from its insanely low score since then.
