UFO UPDATE

Quilters' UFO Challenge 2026 Come Join our UFO Parade in 2026!

This is a chance to turn five UFOs into quilts/finished objects in only one year!

- Decide which of your UFOs need to be quilts/or objects you want finished pick 5.
- Describe the finished quilts or objects on the next page. Make sure that No. 1 is the one you want to work on first. Give enough information to easily identify each quilt/object. For example, "green churn dash" is a better description than "Bill's birthday quilt or Christmas table runner, or pj bottoms." Fill out the list and make a copy for yourself so you know what to work on next!

"Finished" means quilted, bound, and labeled for quilts, and completed items for other objects.

- The first quilt/object, is due on January 14, 2026, and will be No. 1 on your list. It
 may be turned in early. After that, one quilt/object will be due every two months,
 except the fourth one will have three months because we have no meeting in
 July.
- The order of the quilts/objects will be chosen randomly from the remaining numbers. That means that the second quilt due will not necessarily be #2 on your list.
- When you turn in your first UFO for inspection, you will be given a ribbon and a notion to attach, showing that quilt is finished. You will receive another notion for each UFO as it is recorded as finished. There will be drawings for prizes after each due date is reached; therefore, all who finish even just one quilt will be eligible to win a prize that month. Other prizes will be awarded when the year is up.

I can't believe we will only have one more Philanthropy Sew Day this year. We will meet for the last time in 2025 on Wednesday, November 5, 2025, at the Driftwood Mobile Home Park, located at 15621 Beach Blvd., Westminster from 9:30 to 2:30. In December our regular Guild meeting, at the Elks Lodge, will be on the first Wednesday, December 3, so no Sew Day.

We plan to have our first 2026 Sew Day, Wednesday, January 7, 2026: same place and same time. Remember that you are always welcome to come and leave when it is convenient for you. We have a perfect place to accomplish these tasks, the room is large and there are plenty of tables and light. We break for lunch, so bring your lunch and a drink. There is a microwave and refrigerator for our use. Meet some new friends and members you may already know.

We are very slowly catching up. There are lots of quilt tops that need to be prepared for quilting (backing, binding and batting). Fabric is available for both backing and binding and we have a supply of batting; we just need help in putting it all together. Then, of course, we need volunteers to do the quilting. It is a group effort and you have been doing a fantastic job. If we can just continue the process we should be caught up in no time.

Please continue to donate children-themed fabric for pillow cases (at least 1 yard) but we ARE NOT accepting quilt tops at this time. Remember that if you turn in a completed quilt (backed, bound, quilted and labeled) you will be given a ticket for a chance to win a prize at the end of the monthly meeting.

The Philanthropy Table has information that you might find interesting. There are printouts of items needed for the baby baskets that are donated every quarter to the Marines. We still donate Mug Rugs to Meals on Wheels, baby blankets (flannel, knitted, crochet, etc.) for the Navy/Marine Relief Society. There is a list of the organizations that we donate to and patterns that can be used to make a Philanthropy quilt. Stop by and check it out.

I will announce the number of items and who they were donated to at our December meeting. There is never enough times and ways to say THANK YOU for being such a supportive group.
