In the lead up to this event, I have been very reflective, looking back at our small beginnings, and comparing them to what we have become now, in what is a very short space of time. I remember sitting in a small dusty meeting room in the Nottingham Masonic hall, a small group of us sitting around a table, creating what became the Presidents Governing Board, and laying out the foundations for our future without any idea of the size and extent of the success we would achieve, to this day it still makes me swell with pride.

At our first PGB meeting we had 6 chapters and nearly 100 members, we now have 23 chapters and over 1000 members. We donate an average £60,000 a year to charity, have attracted good men into masonry, and saved lodges from closure in a number of Provinces around the country. We are now the largest and most successful Masonic Association in the UK, and this is still "early days" there is so much more we can do together, to be one of the leading lights in the craft.

"Short" - National Memorial Arboretum

- DE13 7AR

The National Memorial Arboretum is Britain's year-round national site of remembrance at Alrewas, near Lichfield, Staffordshire, United Kingdom. It is a spiritually uplifting place which honours the fallen, recognises service and sacrifice, and fosters pride in the British Armed Forces and civilian community. This is a great chance to visit the Venue of the Ride to the Wall without the crowds and you can be back early if you are in the PGB Meeting.

Riders briefing will be **09:30** in the Marquee, departure **10:00**. The scenic route there is less than 10 miles.

The guided return will leave 14:30 in time for PGB

"Long" - Carsington Water - DE6 1ST

Carsington Water is a reservoir operated by Severn Trent Water located between Wirksworth and Kniveton in Derbyshire, England. The reservoir takes water from the River Derwent at Ambergate during winter months, pumping up to the reservoir by 10.5-kilometre long tunnels and aqueduct.

Riders briefing will be **10:30** in the Marquee, departure **11:00**. The route there is around 40 miles.

City Centre Attractions

Lichfield Cathedral - WS13 7LD



Lichfield Cathedral is is the only medieval English cathedral with three spires. The Diocese of Lichfield covers all of Staffordshire, much of Shropshire and part of the Black Country and West Midlands. The stone is sandstone and came from a quarry on the south side of Lichfield. The walls of the nave lean outwards slightly, due to the weight of stone used in the ceiling vaulting; some 200–300 tons of which was removed during renovation work to prevent the walls leaning further.

The Samuel Johnson Birthplace Museum - WS13 6LG

Dr Samuel Johnson is perhaps Lichfield's most famous son. He was born in 1709 in the house on the corner of Breadmarket Street, which is now a museum dedicated to his life.

Beacon Park - WS13 6QZ

Beacon Park is set in more than 70 acres of beautiful gardens and open space. Museum Gardens is the formal part of the park. With its stunning floral displays and avenue of trees, along with the centrepiece fountain, statues of Captain Smith of the Titanic, King Edward VII, and Erasmus Darwin, it is a must-see on your visit.

Erasmus Darwin House - WS13 7AD

Erasmus Darwin House is the former home of the English poet and physician Erasmus Darwin, grandfather of naturalist Charles Darwin.

The Old Guildhall Prison Cells - WS13 6LX



The Old Guildhall Prison for felons and debtors is at the rear of the Guildhall. Visitors can explore original cells and the history of law and order in the city in this small display, on the site which has been in use as a prison since 1548.

National Memorial Arboretum - DE13 7AR

The National Memorial Arboretum is Britain's year-round national site of remembrance at Alrewas, near Lichfield, Staffordshire, United Kingdom. Black Country Living Museum - DY1 4SQ



An award-winning corner of the West Midlands is now one of the finest and largest open-air museums in the United Kingdom. Location for some scenes in Peaky Blinders, this is twenty six acres worth exploring. They have created a 'place' – a real and lively place, where once there was nothing and nobody. With a village and charismatic residents to chat with. Trams to ride. Things being made. Stories to hear. Time to be well spent.

Letocetum Roman Site and Museum (Wall) - WS14 OAW

Letocetum is the ancient remains of a Roman settlement. It was an important military staging post and posting station near the junction of Watling Street, the Roman military road to North Wales, and Icknield Street.

Staffordshire Regiment Museum, Whittington - WS14 9PY

The Staffordshire Regiment Museum is a military museum in Staffordshire, England, preserving the history of the Staffordshire Regiment, its antecedent regiments and its successor regiment, the Mercian Regiment, from 1705 to the present.


Chasewater Railway - WS8 7NL

The Chasewater Railway is a former colliery railway running round the shores of Chasewater in Staffordshire, England. It is now operated as a heritage railway.

Cannock Chase AONB

Cannock Chase was designated as an AONB in 1958 because of its beautiful landscape, its wildlife and its history. Cannock Chase is the largest surviving area of lowland heathland in the Midlands. Wild deer still roam the Chase and are probably descended from the original herd introduced in Norman times for hunting purposes.

Directions



From the North (heading South on M6)

- 1. At junction 11a, Use the left 2 lanes to take the M6 exit to Birmingham/M5
- 2. Keep left to continue on Exit 11, follow signs for A460/Cannock, at the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto A460
- 3. 0.5 m at the roundabout, take the 3rd exit and stay on A460
- 4. 1.6 m at the roundabout, take the 4th exit onto Walsall Rd/Watling St/A34/A5 (do not take M6 Toll)
- Continue on A5 until "Wall Island" Junction with A5148 (Shenstone) Signposted National Memorial Arboretum and Burton A5148. Take 2nd exit.
- 6. At the next roundabout, take the 1st exit onto London Rd/A5206
- 7. 0.5 m (Owl at Lichfield Pub) Turn Right onto Cricket Lane
- 8. 0.3 m Turn right onto Tamworth Rd/A51
- 9. 0.6 m Turn left just before Horse & Jockey Pub.
- 10. LRFC is 250 feet on the right

From the South (heading North on M1)

- 1. Heading north on M1
- 2. At junction 19, take the M6 exit to Coventry/Birmingham
- 3. Continue to J3a Merge onto M42 Northbound (leave M6)
- Follow M42 until J10
- 5. At junction 10, take the first exit to A5 to Tamworth



- 6. Stay on A5 until Weeford Interchange, junction with A38 take the 5th exit onto the A38 ramp to Burton/Lichfield
- 7. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto London Rd/A5206
- 8. 0.5 m (Owl at Lichfield Pub) Turn Right onto Cricket Lane
- 9. 0.3 m Turn right onto Tamworth Rd/A51
- 10. 0.6 m Turn left just before Horse & Jockey Pub.
- 11. LRFC is 250 feet on the right
