


Enabled Children Initiative

• In April, **ECI welcomed a new child** into the Window of Hope family—**Abdullah**, pictured below with a physiotherapist at **ICRC hospital in Kabul**. The child’s parents had brought him to ICRC for treatment and never returned for him. After multiple attempts to locate his parents, and after the government was not able to provide a safe place for him, **ECI**



was able to provide him safe accommodation at Window of Hope.

Abdullah is about 6 years old, and has **cerebral palsy**. He is already showing signs of improvement, and turns his head to look when his name is called. **Many thanks to ICRC hospital for looking after Abdullah.**

• In July, ECI founder and director Lael Mohib will be in Kabul for follow up meetings with the **Ministry of Labor, Social Affairs, Martyrs and Disabled and the Ministry of Urban Development and Housing** to follow-up on the **community center build project**.
