"Green Impact: Building a community of students and staff to change universities from within"

This workshop is informative, interactive and leaves participants with a tangible result: an action plan to improve their community engagement. First, participants will map out how they currently engage students and staff on sustainability. Then, she will inspire participants through theoretical frameworks on how to best design community engagement activities (e.g. Schwartz' theory of basic values). Next, she will introduce Green Impact as a well-tested programme on how to excite students and staff to implement sustainability actions in their departments. Using the practical lessons learned from Green Impact, plus the insights from the theoretical frameworks, participants will reflect on their current community engagement efforts and develop an action plan to improve them.

This workshop is interactive and fun, creating room for dialogue, reflection and thinking.
