This lesson Marilyn learned is very important and should not be ignored. We have to tell people that we love them, thank them, and apologize for what we did to hurt them while we still have time. Likewise, Godwin uses a futuristic environment to teach us a lesson in nature. The space boundary is desered and must abide by nature's strict, cruel laws. Page 21 Godwin writes that there were laws, and the universe moved to obey them. It is not the morality of the laws of nature; That's why they have to die and how marilyn.
