Waiting period. But on Saturday mornings, when we want to retreat with a bottomless mug and paper or when we have company, we still have to pull out an old few cups of coffee maker. Enter the new Keurig 2.0: It is designed to make double duty duty one- and a lot of a cup brewer. Along with that, the cousin of the best of our test single feed machine (Keurig Vue), a model in the new line carafe that uses a 4-cup K-cup to brew up to 4 to 5 cups of coffee at a time. It's so simple, even someone decaffeinated in her system can do it. While we were understandably thrilled with the prospect of making one big pot in the same machine we use for quick grab and go cup in the morning, we found that when filled to the max, the carafe contains only enough coffee to fill three mugs. This means that Keurig 2.0 will satisfy you if you enjoy a second or third pour throughout the morning, or if you regularly make coffee just for you and your husband. But if you're looking for a caffeine full table brunch guests with one carafe, this probably isn't the model for you. However, the future of smart coffee makers looks bright. The Keurig 2.0 display shows that for future iterations, the company is brewing even more options for taste and customization in sizes - including crowd-friendly carafe. Some budget brewers have a great buy at the moment, but not long enough to make them worth it after all. If longevity is a serious problem, simplicity may be better. French presses, pour oatmeal and slab coffee makers, usually lasts a long time because they are so few parts (however, many of them are made of glass).
