Acacia added several new projects to our philanthropy list this year.

Several quilts and bedding sets were sent to the San Carlos Apache Reservation in Arizona earlier this year in an ongoing philanthropy project. This is an annual donation we have made in the Spring for the last several years.

The special needs students at the George Key school in Buena Park received 40 stockings that were made by Helene Born and Isabel Cervantes. North Cities Quilt Guild made another 40 stockings for the school. Helene also spearheaded a project to make grocery bags for the new food pantry opening in Buena Park that was initiated by Council Member Lamiya Haque. Over 150 were made.

Acacia donated 51 placemats to the local Meals on Wheels office. The placemats were well received, and the guild plans to make and donate more in 2026.

We also donated to Thomas House at the holiday party. Two representatives, Nate Shepherd, Development Manager, and Martha Figueroa, Operations Manager, came to receive the 46 filled stockings (made by Acacia members), over two dozen quilts and blankets, as well as several bags of clothing and a stroller/baby car seat combo.

They expressed their gratitude and Nate gave us some background information about Thomas House. They plan to send photos after the holidays.



Adding to our donations to Thomas House this year was Saran Rencher, the author of a children's book, who donated copies of her book as Christmas gifts. Saran was introduced to Acacia by Colleen Drafton, who met her at the dog park. Since she was expecting a baby girl in December, Acacia presented Saran with a pink baby quilt, made by member Stephanie Calderon.
