Culture - Vocabulary

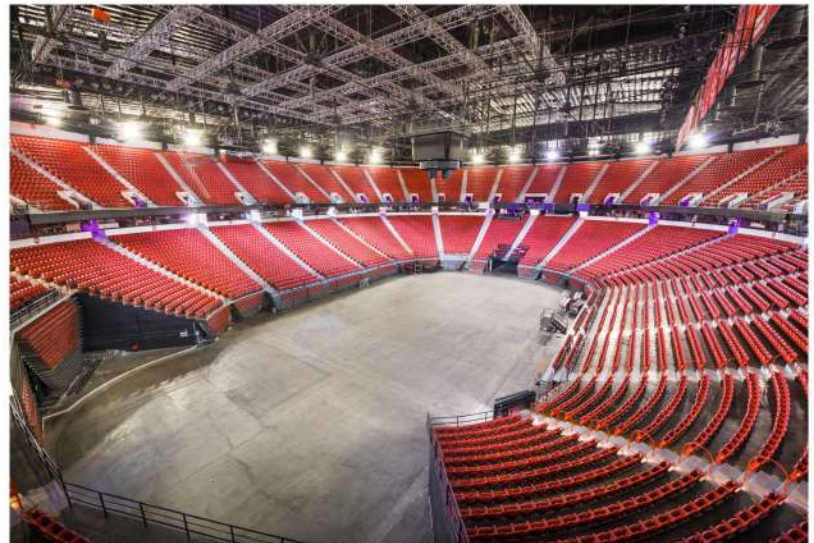
canal: a man-made waterway used for transportation or irrigation (n)
